### "Cause Celebre" in West France.

An extraordinary case, which will no doubt rank as one of the most interesting causes celebres of the year, is now being investigated by the police authorities at Lorient. The case is to be tried by the Morbihan Court of Assizes.

Some details of the affair are given in the *Figaro*.

A Mme. Bertha Crouan is accused of attempting to cause the murder of her husband, M. Octave Crouan, against whom she was engaged in a suit of separation.

The supposition of a crime rests on the declarations made by some street porters at Lorient who were found to be possessed of a comparatively large sum of money, which they declared, was transmitted to them as the price of killing M. Crouan in such a way that it would appear to be an accident.

The street porters declared that they had considered it more prudent not to do the deed, with a prudence no doubt similar to that which induced them to keep the money.

On the strength of these declarations warrants for the arrest of Mme. Crouan and her servant, Marie Criston, were issued, but Mme. Crouan escaped to Switzerland.

At length, tired of living away from France, Mme. Crouan wrote from Geneva that she intended to give herself up a prisoner. She had been, in fact, of her own free will imprisoned in Lorient jail.

Mme. Crouan is the daughter of a very wealthy contractor, M. Brian, who compiled an enormous fortune by his own efforts. A great part of his energy characterized his daughter, who was, it appears, disappointed early in life about a marriage she wished to make. M. Brian lived about twenty or thirty years ago at the Chateau de la Madeleine, near Varades (Loire-Inférieure).

When the marriage on which Mme. Brian had set her heart had been forbidden and put a stop to by her father, she was affianced to a M. Octave Crouan, an engineer, who was closely connected with M. Brian in his business relations.

Mme. Brian announced to her future husband that it was dangerous for him to be the accomplice of her father in opposing her will. But the threat appeared to M. Brian to be due simply to the petulance of youth.

They were married and two children were born, for which their mother had a strong and unbounded affection.

Unhappily this love does not appear to have extended to her husband, and in 1890 Mme. Crouan formed a *liaison* with M. Kerneur, who exercised the profession of teacher in a riding school.

For a time the *liaison* was kept secret, but at the expiration of a few months Mme. Crouan and M. Kerneur took the children of the former and fled to Paris. M. Crouan followed them, found them, and after treating his wife with much leniency, induced her to go and live with him again.

But in January, 1891, M. Crouan was deserted again, and the guilty pair, travelling in great state as man and wife, visited Nice, Mentone and Monte Carlo. After much trouble M. Crouan found them and obtained the guardianship of the children.

During the last summer vacation M. Crouan stayed with the children at Belle-Isle-en-Mer and Mme. Crouan at Quiberon. The mother was to see her children every fortnight. They took the boat for Quiberon in the morning and returned to Belle-Isle at night.

On one occasion they did not arrive; they had missed the boat and had been obliged to stay at Quiberon all night.

M. Crouan was, however, not fully reassured by this explanation, and decided in future to accompany the children. While they were with their mother he used to pass the time walking about the cliffs. It was while thus engaged that the street porters say that they were paid to see that he had a fatal accident.

The affair is at present being thoroughly investigated by the police. It is expected that many sensational revelations will be made at the trial with reference to the career of Mme. Crouan. It should be added that M. Kerneur is not implicated in the affair.
