A WOMAN'S SAD STORY.—Officer Kraus, of the Eastern Baltimore District, arrested Lena Smith, on Saturday, on the charge of obtaining money under false pretenses from people in East Baltimore. Lena appeared before Justice Maloney with a two-year old child in her arms, and told him a pitiful story. She said that she was from Winchester, Va. and nearly two years ago her husband was killed on a railroad and left her helpless with her child. She worked hard and managed to live quite comfortably until about six months ago, when her trouble began. Later she secured a position as domestic with a family on Patterson Park avenue, where she worked until about a week ago. She has not been able to secure employment since, and she admitted to the justice that she obtained the money to save herself from starving. She pretended to collect for a Lutheran church. The mother of the girl, Mrs. Elizabeth Collins, said the story was true, and that her daughter was respectable. Lieut. League notified Agent Parker, of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children, who took the young child, Flora, and committed her to the Nursery and Child's Hospital. The woman seemed somewhat weak-minded, and Justice Maloney released her. She had no place to sleep Saturday night, so Matron McLaughlin, of the Eastern District, comfortably housed her, and will endeavor to secure her a position.

MORE THAN HIS MATCH.—It was on a London bound steamer and several passengers were leaning against the railing talking about shooting. One young man remarked that he had once killed two wild ducks on the wing with one shot. "I suppose it was an accident," he said, "but I'll admit that I take a good deal of credit to myself for being a clever shot."

GENERALS AT GETTYSBURG.—The Union and Confederate chieftains finished their inspection of the Gettysburg Pa., battlefield Thursday. In the morning they drove out on the first day's line to Howard avenue, thence along it to the Harrisburg road, and back through the town to East Cemetery Hill. In the first and second carriages were General Longstreet, General D. E. Sickles, General Alexander and Governor Pattison, of Pennsylvania, and General O. O. Howard, of the United States army; General D. Mc. M. Gregg, General Wm. Mahone, of Virginia, and Colonel Latrobe, Longstreet's chief of staff. From Cemetery Hill the drive was continued over Culp's Hill to Spangler's Spring, and then by way of the national cemetery and the Emmitsburg road to the peach orchard, through the wheatfield, over Little Round Top and back to town by Hancock avenue, stopping at the bloody angle, while the guide described Pickett's charge. There were numerous interesting discussions by the Generals over the various positions and movements of their respective troops.
