Another Snake Story.

Mr. S. S. White (not Mr. W.S. White) is responsible for the following. Mr. S. S. White is quite as reliable as Mr. W. S. White, and hence the *Lance* has no doubt of the absolute truth of this tale, which it tells as it heard it:

Mr. White was going from Fredericksburg to his home, in the county of Spotsylvania, a few evenings since, when he saw this particular snake. Now, just please don't give one of those short, significant little laughs that come so readily upon the mention of a country gentleman going home from town and seeing snakes by the way. Of course, some country gentlemen, going home in the mellow dusk of a spring evening, after a day's hard work with the astute gentlemen who line the sunny side of Commerce street, are likely to see any number of snakes and other tangled things. But, then, our informant doesn't meander along the sunny side of Commerce street, and if he sometimes gets on that side of the street, he keeps clear of the cut-throats of Old Grey and other seductive stimulants.

And to this moment Mr. White is unable to determine which swallowed the other; but goes on his way rejoicing that he can call in good proof of the above snake story.—*Fredericksburg Lance.*
