How to Cook a Virginia Ham.

A good friend of ours, whose writings are always interesting, whether he discourses upon politics or culinary matters or the proper formulas for making egg-nog, or mint juleps, under the signature of "Medicus," tells us "how to cook a ham."

He says: "M. Zetelle, who was the acknowledged prince of cooks, used to say that a ham of bacon ought to be boiled half an hour for every pound of its weight. As an old medical man and a housekeeper for many years in the country, I am decidedly of the conviction that the Monsieur was correct."

Down in our peanut country the opinion is prevalent that this delicious flavor is acquired by the hog rooting in the fields from which the peanut crop has been but lately harvested and where still remain many ants and tender roots; and it is incontestable that the ham of the peanut section of Virginia is held in very high esteem by epicures.

But the ham of other sections of Virginia are also valued highly. Those people have no peanut fields in which to put their hogs to root, but they have receipts for curing hams which have been handed down from father to son, and from mother to daughter, for many generations, and they truly believe that it is these which make their hams so welcome to the palate and so famous the country over.

Virginia ham comes from a porker who has had woods and fields to wander in, and is, truth to say, an aristocratic land owner rather than a penniless, slop-fed, low-born hog. If it is possible for a hog to be a gentleman, that is what the Virginia hog is. Certain it is that his ham is always welcome in a good society, and is often to be seen in the presence of bright men and pretty women.

"Medicus" refrains from any such observations as we have indulged in. He simply argues in favor of Zetelle's method of cooking a ham, and earnestly insists that the man or woman "who furnishes his or her patrons with half-cooked ham ought to be heavily fined, for it operates as a poison to the system." Hence he agrees with Zetelle "that a ham of bacon ought to be boiled half an hour for every pound of its weight."

Since to Virginia is now denied the privilege of furnishing Presidents of the United States, we must hold with a more tenacious grip than ever to our province, not only to see that the Department send out a receipt to cook it so that it may be presented to the household with its delicious flavor unimpaired. The first thing to do is to buy or beg your ham and the next thing is to cook it thoroughly.—Richmond Dispatch.

THEY'RE GOING FISHING.—Ex-Senator Wade Hampton and Congressman Amos Cummings are arranging a fishing trip for Mr. Cleveland and themselves. They will not tell where they are going, but in a few weeks the trio will leave Washington for some point where the fish are supposed to be biting well. The President has a new fishing device which he wants to try. It is a little bottle-shaped apparatus opened at both ends and surrounded by eight formidable hooks. A live minnow is put into the bottle, one end corked up and the decoy is launched into the water, where it floats while the minnow wriggles gaily in his native element.
