### TO THE OWNERS OF DOGS.

Mayor's Office, Alexandria, Va., June 1, 1893.  
In consequence of the increasing number of complaints made recently against the owners of dogs that have bitten people, and in face of the fact that such dogs now in the city which have been bitten by animals of their own species which it was subsequently discovered were suffering from hydrophobia, I hereby order all owners of all animals of the canine species to securely muzzle the same before they be allowed to run large. If any such animal of the dog kind be found running at large during the continuance of this proclamation without the required muzzle, it shall be seized and placed in a pound, and if such animals be not redeemed within forty-eight hours by the payment of a fine of ONE DOLLAR, said animals will be conveyed to a suitable place and slaughtered. This order shall be in force from to-day, June 1st, 1893, to October 1st, 1893.
