### Letter from Norfolk.

NORFOLK, Va., Dec. 13th, 1893.—A Virginia poet wrote that Norfolk possessed a sea shell that held the echo of the lost song of Sappho, which shows how much information there is in an oyster that can evolve such a beautiful thought from the chestnut story of the girl whose fellow went back on her.

The custodian of the shell is "Jim Jones," the restaurant-keeper, and when you don't find a man at his home or his office you are told that he is at "Jim Jones's."

During the recent religious conference six country deacons went to call on a visiting parson, who was out, and the host's servant not knowing the character of his guest or the callers, replied that he "reckoned he must be at Jim Jones's." Then the keeper of Jim's fountain of mirth and comfort was surprised to see six clerical-looking persons range up in front of the bar and ask for the Reverend—but but inclusion of the gentleman was a regular customer and would be in about treat time. So the thirsty sinners as they came and went for an hour were struck with the horrible idea that a temperance crusade had lighted down on the town; and it was some time before the lost song of Sappho was played on the half shell and Jim Jones caught on to the joke and made it a little act.

The United States Court is in session trying pension cases and it makes Norfolk a point attractive for reform to gaze at from afar, and all these will be a judicial precedent against allowing pensions for bogus veterans and the uncles, cousins and aunts of soldiers. There are about seventy cases of various grades and it is expected that the court will adjourn over to the 17th of January after the present week's work. When they reached the water they exclaimed and exclaimed in chorus: "Isn't that nice, it's just like Pinocchio, the way the amateur opera company does it at Richmond."

There are hundreds of sportsmen who come down this line to hunt in the waters of Virginia and North Carolina, for the water fowl seem to have left their Potomac points and sought wider range where the pot hunter has not such a dead shot. At present there are a dozen hunting clubs that have elegant lodges along the waters of the "James" and the inlets from Cape Henry down through the Dismal Swamp and Currituck Sound.

Norfolk has been noted for its enterprise in redeeming this entire section from republicanism and in the recent election distinguished itself for phenomenal manly qualities.

So the people were well served by the Lee-Martin center in which the younger and newer element of the Virginia democracy cleared the field and succeeded in getting the influence of two Senators! "The boys" have waited a long time for their turn to come and they think they have "got there." The bitterness of the fight has subsided but the result remains and the policy of the new regime will be seen in the autumn elections. In the meantime there is an indication of a strong fight against the Anderson-McCormick election law.

### To Buy Bread Instead of Holy!

The fashionable Church of the Heavenly Rest, in New York, will not be decorated this Christmas, but will give its "Christmas holly" fund to the poor. Its pastor, Rev. D. Parker Morgan, proposed this plan to his congregation just before the sermon Sunday morning, and after the service the congregation "informed it." "During the next month," says Dr. Morgan, "I have had ten times more appeals for help than in any other month during the thirteen years since I came to the United States and to this parish. I think the \$400 or \$500 we usually raise for decorations ought not to be expended in that way when there is so much distress." Dr. Morgan hopes that the other churches will follow this good example.
