Now Shoot or Be Shot.—At Buffalo, N. Y., Saturday night George Grawitz went home drunk. He had been on a spree for three weeks, and his wife was not surprised. He ate his supper in silence and then went upstairs into the garret. The wife heard him throwing things about, but paid no attention to him. About half an hour later Grawitz came down stairs with two old-fashioned shotguns. They were loaded to the muzzle, and Grawitz was ugly. He made for his wife, and handing one of the guns to her, he shouted, "Shoot or get shot." The poor woman took the weapon and staggered round the room, vainly attempting to get away. She did not know how to handle the gun, and the gun went off in her hand. The charge entered the ceiling, showering plaster on the couple. The drink-crazed man took this as an acceptance of the challenge for a duel, and, raising his gun to his shoulder, took deliberate aim at his wife.
