MRS. GLENNAN'S ANSWER.—The answer of Mrs. Susan K. Glennan to the suit which her husband recently instituted against her for absolute divorce was filed in the clerk's office in Washington yesterday.

The document covers but two pages of manuscript, but it contains serial denials of the allegations made by her husband, Dr. Arthur H. Glennan, besides a number of counter charges which promise much sensational testimony when the case comes up for trial. She denies her husband's charges, and declares that she has ever conducted herself as a dutiful and faithful wife, and although the complainant has done all in his power to discourage her in this respect, she believes she has succeeded. Owing to his cruel and brutal treatment of her she says she was compelled in August, 1889, to leave him and seek refuge with her sister at Stephentown, Texas.

Her husband's allegation of her infidelity with Arthur Silling is emphatically denied, as is the charge that at any time she ever paid his board or received any assistance from him. The \$72 per month which she has received from her husband for the support of herself and her children, she declares, has been insufficient, and since the filing of her husband's suit this money has not been paid her, and she has been reduced to the necessity of depending on her friends for support. She declares that she is fit and able to provide for her children, and denies the charge that she has been harsh and passionate in her treatment of them. She prays for possession of the children, and proper provision for their maintenance and hers. She is represented by J. Thomas Sotheron.

OFFICIAL.

AN ORDINANCE to amend and reorganize section 49 of an ordinance approved May 12, 1894.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the City Council of Alexandria, Virginia, that section 49 of an ordinance approved May 12th, 1894, be amended and reorganized so as to read as follows: Section 49. On every express company having an office in the city of Alexandria, Virginia, and receiving goods, wares and merchandise and forwarding them to points within the State of Virginia, or receiving goods, wares and merchandise within the State of Virginia and delivering them in the city of Alexandria, there shall be levied and collected a license tax of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150).

MONETARY AND COMMERCIAL.

Business is fairly active, the merchants reporting an average fall trade. Monetary affairs are without features. In New York yesterday money on call was easy at 1 per cent. Prime mercantile paper 3 1/2 per cent. In Baltimore rates ranged from 4 to 5 per cent. on call and 5 to 6 per cent. for time loans and discounts. Local shares are quiet, with little change in prices.

NEW YORK, Oct. 12.—11 a. m.—The general market soon developed strength and under the leadership of American sugar advanced 1/2 to 2 1/2 per cent. The feeling for the moment is a little more bullish and there is an impression that the market will broaden considerably before election day. At 11 o'clock the market was a shade easier in tone.

CHICAGO CATTLE MARKET, Oct. 11.—The supply of cattle was moderate and about everything was worked off. Natives were quoted up to \$3.25, with sales very generally at \$3.44.75 for steers. The calf market was steady at \$2.25 to \$5.50. In the hog market there was a brisker demand and prices were higher all around. They advanced 5 to 10c immediately on topping off business. Although the proportion of good hogs was small they sold above \$5.10, and there were many sales at \$5.45 to \$5.55. The close was strong. Comparatively few of the sheep went above \$2.85, and the bulk could be bought below \$2.65. Lambs were quoted up to \$4 for choice.

NEW YORK CATTLE MARKET, Oct. 11.—Beef—very little doing; light bulls sold at \$2.15 to \$2.25 per 100 lbs.; no exports to-day. Calf—veal and grassers steady; light Western calves higher; poor to prime veals \$5 to \$7.50 per 100 lbs.; grassers \$2.25 to \$2.50 per 100 lbs. Sheep and Lambs—market steady, but very dull; poor to good market \$2.30 per 100 lbs. Hogs—market firmer; inferior to choice hogs \$5.50 to \$6.10 per 100 lbs.
