GREAT LIGHT ON A LAKE.

The Detroit and Milwaukee steamer was more than half way across Lake Michigan Friday night when the pilot saw a bright light off the starboard bow. He could not account for it, and called the captain. The captain, too, was puzzled, and, thinking that the boat must have veered from her course, and that the light was from Grand Haven, he ordered her headed for it. It was calculated that the light was fifteen miles ahead. After proceeding ten miles a companion light appeared some five miles to the westward. The passengers, who had by this time been aroused, gathered on the deck and watched these lights, which now began to flash at intervals.

On went the steamer, and as she approached the light the passengers were obliged to hold up umbrellas and other objects to shade their eyes from the intense glare. So bright was that light that it seemed to rise between the boat and the light, but the blaze was flashed over its top. In a few minutes the mountain sank backward, and the lights were seen, still too brilliant for the eye to endure.

At just 2 a. m. by the captain's watch, the lights flashed, there was a terrific rumbling like a quadruple peal of thunder, and then the lights disappeared. Almost on the instant a tidal wave struck the boat and the phenomenon was over.

No one attempts to explain the strange occurrence. The boat, which was fifteen miles out of her course, was over an hour late in arriving.

A commercial travelling man named Dunn, who was on the boat, said that the glare was greater than two noonday suns, and that he really believed the end of the world had come.

The captain has made an official report of the phenomenon to the secretary of the company, and these facts are taken from that report.

BISHOPS ON INSPIRATION.

In accordance with the authority conferred upon them by a council of the bishops of the American Protestant Episcopal Church, held in New York last October, a committee of bishops, consisting of John Williams, bishop of Connecticut and presiding bishop; William Cresswell Doane, bishop of Albany; F. D. Huntington, Bishop of Central New York; William E. McLaren, bishop of Chicago; George F. Seymour, bishop of Springfield, and Henry C. Potter, bishop of New York, have issued a pastoral letter to the clergy and laity throughout the country, which was distributed in New York on Sunday to the rectors of the churches.

The address thereof is "The Incarnation of Our Lord Jesus Christ" and "The Inspiration of the Holy Scriptures."

After asserting that no discovery of modern research, positively ascertained, is of a character to unsettle a Christian's faith in any particular, the letter continues:

"Any instruction or any study which makes any part of the Bible less authoritative than it really is, which weakens faith in its inspiration, which tends to eliminate Christ from the utterances of the prophets, or which leads a man to think of miracles with a half-suppressed skepticism, is a pernicious instruction and a pernicious study.

"In the ages all along, since the first council was held in Jerusalem, the safety and honor of the church have been endangered as much by the inroads of disbelief in revelation and by lax construction of creeds and oaths of allegiance as by the idolatry of the East or the barbarism of the West."

DISEASE SPREAD BY FUNERALS.—A scourge of black scarlet fever is prevalent at Egypt, Lehigh county, Pa., and deaths are of daily occurrence. It is believed that the spread of the disease is due to the public funerals of the victims. The attendance is usually very large. Monday Lebanon Mohr and his 4 year-old son, both of whom died of the disease, were buried side by side, and the church where the services were held was crowded.

The public funerals have aroused the indignation of the entire neighborhood, and efforts will be made to have them stopped. There has been four deaths recently in the Mohr family, and the disease exists in a dozen or fifteen houses.
