### AT MOUNT VERNON.

Mr. Harrison H. Dodge, superintendent at Mount Vernon, in a letter, dated October 20th, says:

Hundreds of trees were broken down or mutilated, among them the historic magnolia and other especially interesting trees near the mansion. Only within the last few days has the task of clearing the lawns of debris been accomplished. There are many broken tops yet awaiting attention, stumps to be dug out, etc. The men are working in the deer park now, where the destruction of large trees was very great. Some trees fell across the iron fence and broke it badly, but with the exception of a few panes of glass blown out of the green-house, none of the buildings were injured.

The road to the West Lodge gate is completely blocked and everywhere through the woods the violence of the storm is still apparent. High waves, driven by the gale, swept entirely over the wharf, and it is a marvel that the whole structure was not wrecked.

The river bank, not protected by the sea wall, was considerably undercut and broken. The most unaccountable freaks of the storm are evident on all sides. Some trees which stood in open positions, were unharmed, while others, in sheltered places, were uprooted. Many ugly and undesirable trees we should have been glad to see carried off, were left without the breaking of a single limb, and those most cherished were crippled beyond redemption.

Damaged buildings could be renewed, but the dear old trees must forever bear the destroyer's mark.

The work of restoration and preservation is a continual one at Mount Vernon. Fortunately the receipts from the entrance fees of visitors during the past year will enable the ladies of the Mount Vernon Association to repair the damages sustained from the hurricane.

### HOW TO VOTE.

In voting for President and Vice President Tuesday, November 3rd, 1896:

1st. Scratch out the names of all the candidates for President and Vice President except those for whom you wish to vote.

2nd. Do not, under any circumstances, scratch the name of any elector on the ticket, but leave them all of every party untouched. This is important.

In voting for member of Congress, scratch out the name of the person for whom you do not wish to vote, leaving only the name of the candidate for whom you desire your ballot to be cast. No name is legally scratched unless the mark extends at least three-fourths of the way through it.

These instructions are rendered necessary by the fact that section 8 of the Parker bill, passed by the last legislature, changes the method of voting for President and Vice President by providing that "qualified voters shall designate their preference for any candidate for President and Vice President by scratching the names of the other candidates for President and Vice President."

### THE VATICAN IS INTERESTED.

The London Pall Mall Gazette yesterday afternoon published a despatch from Rome which said: "The presidential election (in the United States) is the absorbing topic at the Vatican, the explanation being the strides which Catholicism has made in America, which is now one of the church's largest sources of income. It is recognized that the standing danger to Romanism in the United States is the independence of the American bishops, noticeable since the time of Pius XI. The latter fully recognized that these bishops enjoyed greater power than their brethren elsewhere, and he showed that he understood this by his witty answer to some English priests who asked for certain privileges. He said: 'I am, as you say, pope, yet I cannot accept your request. But,' added the pontiff, with a slight twinkle in his eye, 'I can show you a way to obtain your desire. Go to America, for there the bishops are greater than the Pope.'"

"On the accession of Pope Leo matters assumed a different aspect. He charged Mgr. Satolli with the duty of intimating to the bishops in unmistakable language the limits of their powers, and the result was something like a split, which it took Mgr. Satolli two years to heal. But his mission had good results."

Continuing, the correspondent of the Pall Mall Gazette remarks that the Vatican does not desire its representatives in America to take an active part in the campaign, fearing a new division in the ranks, and apprehending at the same time that some of the most impetuous bishops might break out. He adds that this feeling of uneasiness at the Vatican will not disappear until after election.

OLD BRIDE, YOUNG GROOM.—A wedding that occasions no little talk in New York just now is that of W. W. Newton, jr., nephew of Rev. Dr. Herber Newton, and Miss Henrietta Augusta Richardson, of Boston, which was recently announced. The bridegroom has not yet attained his majority, while the bride, who was a widow, has a married daughter, and is herself on the shady side of forty.

The marriage ceremony was performed by R. V. Dr. Houghton, pastor of the "Little Church Around the Corner," who has united a great many couples, but few in which the bride's years were double those of her bridegroom. Another instance, however, in which the age of the bride was twice that of the bridegroom was the wedding of the Duke of Castelucia, of New York, who at seventy-four took a husband of thirty-seven.

The night of the marriage the husband left Florida for New York, and never returned to his bride. There is a contest now pending in the courts there over the will of the Duchess, by the provisions of which the youthful husband inherited just ten dollars.
