



DE WAGSTAFFES DIVORCED.
The end of one romance of the Everglades which interested New York a little over three years ago this month, has come prosaically in the Providence Plantations, where a divorce has been granted to Evelyn de Wagstaffe, formerly of New York, from William de Wagstaffe, who at one time made him self widely, if not favorably, known about town as "Baron" de Wagstaffe. Mrs. de Wagstaffe was Miss Evelyn O'Brien. She is a niece of a member of the British Parliament. For half a dozen years prior to 1894 she had lived practically as an adopted daughter with Mr. and Mrs. Henry P. Kingsland, of 102 east Nineteenth street, New York. She accompanied Mrs. Kingsland to St. Augustine, Fla., in the middle of March, 1894 and they put up at the Hotel San Marco. "Baron" de Wagstaffe was then working as a reporter or the St. Augustine Daily Press. He was about 30 years old. Miss O'Brien was 20. Wagstaffe was tall and of light complexion. Miss O'Brien was fair and was described as having a remarkably beautiful face. De Wagstaffe's father had been made a baron by Victor Emanuel and the son stuck to the title, or stuck the title to himself. Miss O'Brien and the baron met. Mrs. Kingsland also had seen the baron once or twice up to the time when, toward the end of March, she left St. Augustine for Charleston, taking Miss O'Brien with her. Presently the baron appeared in Charleston. Miss O'Brien was to start north on the 27th. She started. Later in the day Mrs. Kingsland received a note from de Wagstaffe, saying that he and Miss O'Brien were going to be married. The wedding had already taken place when the note reached Mrs. Kingsland. The ceremony was performed by Rev. Dr. Freyler, of St. Michael's Church, Charleston. The de Wagstaffes came to the Hotel Bartholdi, in New York, on April 4, and on April 19 moved over to the Hotel Gerlach. The fact of the marriage did not leak out here until May 1. When it became known that de Wagstaffe was married and was in town so many people called to see him that he cleared out. Mrs. de Wagstaffe had no money of her own. In a few months she was obliged to part with her jewels, and when everything available on which to raise money was gone she returned to Mr. and Mrs. Kingsland's home. In the summer of 1895 Mrs. Kingsland went to Newport and Narragansett. Mrs. de Wagstaffe accompanied her, and has since remained in Rhode Island, making her residence in Providence with the intention of securing a divorce. The decree was granted on April 10 last in Providence by Judge Tillinghast, the grounds for it being desertion and non-support. —[N. Y. Sun.]
