LEGISLATIVE NOTES.

The Senate on Tuesday passed House bills to amend section 929 of the code in relation to jail inspection.

To amend section 3430 of the code so as to require a record to be kept of money under control of courts.

To amend section 2547 of the code providing for the reclamation of wills.

The House passed the Senate bill to amend section 838 of the code relating to the compensation of supervisors, as amended, etc.

Also House bills to empower any judge or justice of the Commonwealth before a minor under 16 years of age is convicted of a misdemeanor to substitute stripes in lieu of fine and imprisonment, or of either, with the consent of the parent or guardian of such minor.

To amend and re-nest section 2507 of the code, in relation to list of writings recorded to be posted by clerk.

To amend section 2716 of the code in relation to unlawful detainers, approved March 4, 1890.

To establish a State geologic and economic survey and provide for an investigation of the natural resources of the State, and preparing and publishing of reports, maps, &c., illustrating and making known the character of these resources.

To amend section 3922 of the code touching the appointment of special police.

Bills were introduced to amend section 3909 of the code with reference to clerks keeping registers and descriptive lists of persons convicted of felony, and copy of list to be evidence of identity, form of register, and with reference to take photographs.

To amend an act to require sheriffs and sergeants of the counties and cities to make report to the judges of the counties and cities the number of prisoners on the first day of each month.

The bill to consolidate and make firm and stable all contracts heretofore made with any county court or board of supervisors of any of the counties in the State by virtue of which contracts law officers have been and are now being maintained on county property, came up on a "recommendation" that it do not pass. The bill was dismissed.
