

HERE IS THE LAW.

1. The President is Commander-in-Chief of the Army and Navy, and of all other land and naval forces called into the service of the United States. (U. S. Con., Art. II., Sec. 2.)

2. The land forces consist of all persons enrolled or organized under the authority of the United States, or of the several States, for military service on land. (Act of Cong., May 8, 1872.)

3. The militia consists of that portion of the land forces which is organized within the respective States under the laws of the United States and of the several States. (Act of Cong., May 8, 1872.)

4. The President may call forth the militia to execute the laws of the United States to suppress insurrection, or to repel invasion. (Act of Cong., Feb. 28, 1795.)

5. It belongs exclusively to the President to judge when the exigency arises in which he has authority under the Constitution to call forth the militia, and his decision is conclusive upon all other persons. (Decision of the U. S. Supreme Court in *Martin v. Mott*, 12 Wheaton, 19.)

6. When employed in the service of the United States, the militia are subject to the same rules and regulations and articles of war as are the troops of the United States; but courts-martial or the trial of militia shall be composed of militia officers only. (Act of Cong., Feb. 28, 1875.)

7. Militia, when called into the service of the United States, are not to be considered as being in that service, or in the character of national militia, until they are mustered at the place of rendezvous; and, until then, the State retains a right, concurrent with the government of the United States, to punish their delinquency. But after they have entered into the service of the United States, their character changes from State to national militia, and the authority of the general government over such detachments is conclusive. (Decision of U. S. Supreme Court in *Douglas v. Moore*, 5 Wheaton, 1.)

8. Congress shall have power to provide for organizing, arming, and disciplining the militia, and for governing such part of them as may be employed in the service of the United States, reserving to the States, respectively, the appointment of the officers and the authority of training the militia according to the discipline prescribed by Congress. [U. S. Con., Art. I, Sec. 8.]
