### KENTUCKY MORMONS GO ARMED.

A dispatch from Vanceburg, Ky., says the unusual sight of members of a religious organization going to and from their place of worship armed with shotguns to protect themselves against so-called "Whitecaps" was witnessed in the Pleasant Hill neighborhood of the county on Tuesday. It is in this region that the Mormons have gained a strong foothold by their missionary work, several of the best citizens of the village having been converts to the Mormon belief. At a considerable expense the band had built a church, which was about to be dedicated a few weeks ago, when a firebug applied the torch to it, and it was destroyed. Since then some of the elders have been beaten and other assaults have been committed on the Mormons by alleged whitecaps.

The Mormons say they know who burned their church, which was the only one of their faith in the State, but they say they will not prosecute them, wishing to avoid further trouble. Several farmers have only recently been ordained as elders in the church. Last week Elders Charles Hauch and J. T. Poble received notice through the mails that if they did not quit giving shelter to and aiding the "Mormons from Utah," who had been stepping with these men for several days they would be severely dealt with. The Mormons say they do not want to have any trouble, but will protect themselves from violence.

It is said to-day that preparations are being made for the entire membership of the local church to go to Utah and settle permanently. J. N. Parker, of Pleasant Hill neighborhood, and Elder Blackburne left there on Saturday for Salt Lake City to prepare for the exodus.

WHIPPED HER BIG DAUGHTER.—A handsome young woman, stylishly groomed, expensive rings adorning her hands and a diamond butterfly fastened to the meshes of her velvet collar, appeared in the Harlem police court on Wednesday and asked for a summons for her mother, Mrs. Tate, who, she said, had assaulted her. She also asked for a warrant for the arrest of her sister, Mrs. Soutle, who, she said, had horsewhipped her. She said she was 30 years old, and was the mistress of her mother and sisters, but was unable to keep pace with their demands for money. Last Saturday night, according to Miss Tate's story, her mother asked her for money, and when she answered that she had none, assaulted her, knocked her to the floor, beat and kicked her and finally pelted her with brick-bats.

THEY DIDN'T ADVERTISE.—Since Christmas there have been ten failures reported of concerns that made a specialty of goods intended for holiday presents. Some of these concerns carried large stocks, and were entitled to the designation "big." In one or two instances the stocks were valued at more than \$250,000. The noticeable feature about each of the collapsed concerns is that it did not advertise in the newspapers. The stores that did advertise were crowded with customers from the commencement of the holiday season to the hour of closing the night before Christmas. They all report the greatest holiday business in years.—[N. Y. Sun.]

ANOTHER CATTLE KING FAILS.—Walter M. Clark, Sullivan county's (Md.) cattle king, has failed for nearly \$200,000. The Chicago Live Stock Commission Company, according to the records of that county, holds \$40,000 of his paper and \$40,000 more unsatisfied is held by commission firms in St. Joseph, Kansas City and Omaha. It is said the assets will not cover the liabilities. Recent desperate cattle plunges and poor sales caused the failure. Clark has turned over all his property to his creditors.
