

RAILROAD CONNECTIONS.—In the Circuit Court at Woodstock, yesterday, Judge Harrison denied the petition of the Southern Railway Company to permit that corporation to so detain its afternoon north bound passenger train at Harrisonburg as to give Rockingham county people two hours' stay to that place between trains, on the ground that the connection at Strasburg Junction with the Valley Branch of the Baltimore and Ohio was of paramount importance.

To the ruling of the court, as well as the decision of Wednesday night, which compels the Southern to connect at Strasburg Junction, the Southern excepted, and yesterday afternoon came before the court on two bills as a basis for appeal. Notice has been given and the judgment of the court has been suspended fifteen days from the rising of the court to permit the preparation of the record and of a petition for a supersedeas.

It is regarded as almost certain that an appeal will be awarded by the appellate court, and this will suspend the judgment of the lower court until the matter can be heard by the Court of Appeals at its next session at Staunton, unless it can be transferred to Richmond and there heard. The schedule will remain in as at present until the decision of the Court of Appeals.

The Southern's attorneys claim that the chief object of the appeal is to have the Court of Appeals to pass upon the powers of the State railroad commissioner with reference to such cases as the recent direct orders of State Commissioner Hill as to the operation of trains.
