ADULTERATED FOOD.

The U. S. Senate committee on manufactures yesterday submitted to the Senate a report on the extensive investigation it has conducted into allegations that many important articles of food and drink are adulterated so as to be either a serious detriment to the public health or, where the adulteration is not injurious to health, a fraud on the purchaser. Accompanying the report is a great mass of testimony taken in the leading cities of the country. The report says the importance of the investigation made and the legislation proposed cannot be too strongly emphasized.

"The adulteration of prepared or manufactured foods is very extensively practiced, and in many cases to the great discredit of our manufacturers. It is only fair to say, however, that a large proportion of the American manufacturers who are engaged in adulterating food products do so in order to meet competition, and it is the expression of those gentlemen to say: 'We would be glad to get out of the business of adulterating. We would like to quit putting this stuff in coffee, and would be willing to send our syrups for what they are, but our competitors get a trade advantage which we cannot surrender.'"

"It is the purpose of this committee to adopt this uniform rule: To prohibit the sale of deleterious and unhealthy food products, and as to those food products which are simply cheapened by adulterants, to compel the making of these goods for what they are. Deleterious food products should be prohibited and the rest thoroughly regulated."

THE LAND GRABBERS' LAW.

The two branches of the legislature have adopted the report of the conference committee on the land grabbers' law. This measure now goes to the Governor, who is expected to approve it today. The law which this is to be substituted for brought into the Treasury more than \$100,000, but it proved one of the most obnoxious measures adopted by the legislature since the close of the war. The bill just completed, which engaged the attention of the two Houses for more than two weeks, it is claimed remedies many of the most objectionable features of the old law. Senator Jeffries is the author of this last measure, with some amendments.

In the bill as adopted the penalty is fixed at 10 per cent. of the amount of taxes due, the whole not to exceed \$20 nor to be less than \$5. The new law provides that notice of application is not to be served upon the person in possession, but upon the owner or heirs, as shown by the will and deed books. Failure to give notice vitiates the deed, but the burden of proof of such failure is to rest upon the party attacking the deed. The applicant to purchase is also required to deposit 10 per cent. of the purchase price when making this application.

RELIC OF JACKSON.—The Stonewall Jackson Memorial Association, for the charter of which the Senate has passed a bill, has come into possession of an interesting relic of General Jackson. It is the bed on which the distinguished Confederate commander died, at the house of Mr. Thomas Chanler, of Guiney's Station, Caroline county. It was yesterday received in Richmond by Dr. Hunter McGuire, chairman of the executive committee of the association.

The relic was presented to this gentleman by Mr. J. Calton Boulware, to whose mother it was given by Mr. Chanler, its original owner. It has been in the possession of the Boulware family ever since. It was by that gentleman given to be sold for the purpose of raising the money to erect a memorial on the spot where Jackson was shot, but the memorial was raised without need of the sale. The relic will be placed in the Chanler house as soon as that property is acquired by the association.


