## THE CENSUS ENUMERATORS.

A number of applications have been sent from this city to Mr. R. R. Campbell, at Warrenton, supervisor of census for the Eighth Congressional district, for positions of census enumerators. The applicants will learn their fate shortly, as the census director will confirm the appointments by the 1st of April. The successful ones will then be furnished the requisite papers and be compelled to study the census system, regulations and usages closely for thirty days, and master it in that time, before being officially commissioned.  
Before receiving his commission each enumerator will have to take an oath or affirmation that he will faithfully discharge all the duties required of him under the law.  
The compensation to be paid to enumerators is fixed by section 16 of the act of March 3, 1899, and a minimum rate of two cents for each living inhabitant, two cents for each death, fifteen cents for each farm, and twenty cents for each establishment of productive industry, while in subdivisions where per capita rates are established, having reference to the nature of the region to be canvassed and the density or sparseness of settlement, or other considerations pertinent thereto, the compensation allowed to enumerators will be not less than three nor more than six dollars per day of ten hours actual field work each. Except in extreme cases, no claim for mileage or traveling expenses will be allowed any enumerator and then only when authority has been previously granted by the director of the census.  
Any enumerator who, without justification, neglects or refuses to perform the duty of his position, after accepting an appointment and qualifying for the work, or who communicates to any person not authorized to receive the same any information gained by him in the performance of his duties, will be subject to a fine of five hundred dollars.  
The taking of the census will begin on June 1, and it is very important that the people should be ready to answer the questions which the enumerators will be required to put. The questions are prescribed by law and the value of the statistics will depend chiefly upon the completeness of the answers given.
