

ENGLISH PRINCESS AT CAPITAL.—The Princess Arbert of Anhalt, the granddaughter of Queen Victoria, arrived at the British embassy in Washington on a Saturday at noon. She was received by Lord and Lady Pauncefote and the Misses Pauncefote, who drove to the station to meet their royal guest.

Elaborate preparations were made at the embassy to receive the Princess. The handsome suite of apartments was prepared for her.

Lord and Lady Pauncefote entertained a dinner that evening in honor of the Princess, at which were present only the members of the British embassy and the lady-in-waiting to the Princess.

Princess Louise is 29 years old, but she appears to be much younger, having a very vivacious and girlish manner. She is tall and of characteristic English type with blue eyes, radiant complexion and blonde hair. The Princess is the daughter of Princess Helena, and was born August 12, 1872. She was married to Prince Albert of Anhalt, of Denmark, on July 6, 1891.

She is in Washington as a tourist and solely for pleasure.

WHAT TO DO WITH KRUGER.—A dispatch from London says the personal status of President Kruger since he left Pretoria is creating some discussion. Lord Salisbury will consider him to be President of the South African Republic until Lord Robert is ready to annex that territory. Wherever Kruger may be, even if he goes into Portuguese territory, any communications from him looking to a cessation of hostilities would receive official recognition. Some such message from "Tom Paul" is now expected at the foreign office.

The British government is determined that Kruger cannot stay in the Transvaal after the war. It is captured in duration; but he must be got out of the territory. Officials, however, believe Kruger will manage to get into Portuguese territory, where the British will be unable to touch him.


