

KHEDIVE ARRIVES IN ENGLAND.—Abbas Hilmi, the Khedive of Egypt, arrived in English waters on his first official visit to that country.

The Khedive is accompanied by the commander of the Anglo-Egyptian forces, Gen. Wingate, and Sir James Rennell Rodd, the British secretary of legation and secretary of the consulate general in Egypt.

The Duke of Cambridge, the Turkish Ambassador, Ancho Pulo, Pasha, and a number of other distinguished persons, with a guard of honor, assembled at the Charing Cross station to welcome the Khedive, but they received the information, after a tiresome wait, that his highness was suffering from sickness and would in consequence postpone his departure for Port Victoria for London.
