



WILL SUPPORT THE DEMOCRATIC TICKET.

Prof. L. M. Blackford, of the Episcopal High School, a man of superior attainments and unquestioned patriotism; was so opposed to the silver plank of the Chicago platform, that he would not vote for Bryan and Sewall in 1896, but gave his support to Palmer and Buckner. After the nomination of Bryan and Stevenson at Kansas City, we desired to know the views and intentions of the intelligent "gold democrats" of this section (after witnessing the results of four years of McKinleyism), and selecting Mr. Blackford as one of the best representatives of that class of voters, we addressed him a letter requesting his views on the present situation, and received the following in reply:

Episcopal High School, Fairfax Co., Va., July 9, 1900.

Editor of the Fairfax Herald:

In response to your courteous request of last week, I beg leave to submit briefly my views on the present Presidential contest.

I am a Cleveland democrat and, the Venezuelan episode excepted, have since 1884 been ever proud to profess myself a follower of the eminent statesman who preceded Mr. McKinley in the White House. As a gold democrat in 1896 I voted for Palmer and Buckner, and I am as much a gold man now as then. The great difference now is that silver is not a leading issue, and the election of a silver executive and a silver House could for years to come accomplish nothing toward deranging the currency legislation happily enacted by the last Congress.

I now support Bryan and expect to vote for him in November. This is not because I admire the man, or have a particle more of sympathy than before with the material parts of the Chicago platform which were repeated in that recently promulgated at Kansas City, but for one sound and sufficient reason only.

Imperialism, the foolish and wicked policy of the republican party, gravely menaces the liberties and best interests of the American people and should be checked at all hazards and at any cost. It is the paramount issue now, compared to all others are comparatively insignificant, and, if Bryan were to me ten times as objectionable as he is, I should advocate his election over that of the arch enemy of his country who now occupies the Presidential chair.
