TO WORK FOR BRYAN. An important secret conference of colored democrats was held in Chicago Tuesday to devise means to capture the colored vote for Bryan. The conference was composed of 16 colored men, representing 14 states, and was assembled at the suggestion of the national democratic committee.

A permanent organization was effected, with J. H. Lion Turner, former Minister to Liberia, now a lawyer of St. Louis, as chairman; and Harvey Thompson, of the city attorney's office, of Chicago, secretary.

Former Gov. William J. Stone, of Missouri, representing the democratic national committee, addressed the conference. He favored an immediate organization of a national negro executive committee, having advisory powers with the general committee in the matter of securing colored votes. He promised the full support of the national committee and urged secrecy.

It was decided by the conference to establish a bureau in Chicago for the purpose of disseminating campaign literature and provide colored "spies" to be sent to the work of the street in the alleged attitude of Governor Roosevelt toward the soldiers—"the slandering of the Tenth Cavalry."

Rev. Whitman, a colored preacher from Atlanta, Ga., was present and pledged the colored Methodist Church would contribute to Bryan's election. Rev. Whitman is said to have come directly from Bishop Turner.

FRIGHTENED TO DEATH.—Thomas Partridge, a Penfield, N. Y., farmer, has taken the first steps in an action for \$10,000 damages, against Mrs. Russell Terrill, a neighbor. The suit grows out of the death of little Mary Partridge, who, according to the father's statement, was so terrified by a false-faced woman by Mrs. Terrill that she suffered from nervous shocks which caused her death. The complaint recites that Mrs. Terrill entered the Partridge home one day last December wearing a hideous false-face, and called to the child: "I've come for you. I will take you away." Terror sent the child into convulsions. Her parents say that night and day she would shudder in fear of the horror of that day, and grew rapidly weaker until death came on July 30.

BRIDE FLED WITH HIS GOLD.—Rich Jacob Krebs, an elderly farmer, living near Danbury, Conn., answered a matrimonial advertisement six weeks ago, and as a result he a few days later married Mrs. Marie Lange, a widow of New York. On Saturday Mrs. Krebs disappeared, leaving this note: "I have gone to Germany with another man. You will not see me again. I have taken some money and other things, but they are on my share as a wife." A large sum of money, just how much Krebs' attorney will not say, a gold watch and chain, and some articles of household utility were gone. "Our married life was so happy the first few weeks," said Krebs, describing his missing wife. She was so sweet and kind, and such a good housekeeper."
