FOR THE RELIEF OF THE SUFFERERS.—Mr. M. B. Harlow has had interviews with the pastors of the different churches in the city and the members of the choirs during the past few days and arrangements have been made to hold a meeting at the rooms of the Business Men's League Monday night to perfect arrangements for giving a concert at the Opera House on Thursday night for the benefit of the suffering people of Galveston. This will be a pleasant manner in which our people can contribute to the relief of the many hungry and hungry ones, who, through no fault of theirs, are now destitute of the necessities of life. It is hoped that the sale of tickets will be large. The pastors of the different churches have been requested to make announcements of the proposed meeting and concert from their respective pulpits tomorrow. Members of the City Council have signed a paper to appropriate \$100 for the benefit of the sufferers, and will ratify their action at the next meeting of Council.

I do not wish to interfere with any man in making an honest living, but he should not become a public nuisance in so doing. Most of these hucksters have their regular customers, and could go to them quietly and dispose of their wares. It has been asserted that before a man can join the guild he has to stand an examination, and if he cannot be distinctly understood at the distance of six squares, he is not admitted.

THIRD WARD. MISS JEWETT.—Miss Lillian Clayton Jewett, of Boston, Mass., left Richmond yesterday afternoon for New York rather unexpectedly. It is possible that the fact that her mail yesterday morning in the young woman received letters advising her to take this course had something to do with her departure. She admitted that she had received a number of communications from Richmond people, but declined to discuss their nature. The people of Richmond were much displeased with her sentiments expressed to negroes, and she received many letters warning her that if she stood too long something might happen the reverse of pleasant. She also received a challenge from John E. Eggleston, a young lawyer, offering to debate the subject of lynching with her in a hall, the money arising therefrom to be donated to the orphans of negroes lynched in the South. She ignored the proposition.

MISS JEWETT was greatly disappointed that she did not receive a more cordial reception at the hands of the colored convention and members of that race generally. She confessed that at Richmond, the former capital of the Confederacy, she expected to be given a rousing reception by the negroes.

FATH CURISTS INHIBITED.—Harry E. Sollenberger and Erna Sheets were yesterday indicted in Philadelphia Pa, for the murder of Edward Hack, a seven-month-old infant. The contention of the Commonwealth is that Sollenberger, assisted by Sheets, contacted the "Bunick Orphanage" or "Pie Baked Home" Mission, and the Hack baby was one of the infants in their charge. The little one became ill, but instead of securing for it medical attention, it is charged, the defendants depended on faith to cure the baby, with the result that the infant died.
