LOCAL BREVITIES.

Thursday will be All Saints' and Friday All Soul's Day.

The Citizens' National Bank is being handsomely repaired and improved.

The laying of the Washington street sewer has been almost completed, connection having been made today with the main sewer on King street.

A game of football will take place this evening between the Episcopal High School and the Western High School of Georgetown on the High School grounds.

The work of tearing up the obnoxious pavement around the Confederate monument preparatory to the laying of the vitrified block pavement there has been commenced.

General Wilson, Chief of the United States Engineers, in his annual report earnestly recommends the construction by Congress of the Memorial Bridge across the Potomac at Arlington and the boulevard.

There will be a mass meeting of the democrats of the county at Ballston school house, in Arlington district, tomorrow night at 7:30 o'clock. Mr. Lewis Mack, N. Capt. Patrick O'Fallon and other prominent speakers will address the meeting.

The increasing transportation of cars over the Baltimore and Ohio ferry from this city to Shepherd's continues to augment, and the present month of October will break the record, as it will have ferried over 2,000 cars. Nearly all the coal used by the Southern Railway Company now comes over that ferry.

The motor on the car leaving Washington at 5:40 o'clock yesterday evening derailed when the train arrived at St. Asaph. As a result a train had to be taken from the road or house at Four mile run, and traffic was delayed for some time. The passengers aboard the car arrived in this city at 6:50 p. m.

As the train on the Southern Railway which left Washington at 4:13 o'clock yesterday was passing by the station, a stone through a window of one of the cars, but no one was hurt. The stone is believed to have been thrown by a colored man who had stolen a ride and who jumped from the train when he was detected.

In Washington yesterday John E. Reeves entered suit against the Washington, Alexandria and Mount Vernon Railway Company for \$30,000. He was jerked off a car, he represents, after having bought a ticket in this city; his leg was broken and he received other injuries. The date of the occurrence is said to have been February 22, 1900.

A young colored woman named Rose Hall, living in the northern part of the city, reported at the station house this morning that while on her way home last night from a party at Johnson's she was assaulted and robbed by Robert Johnson, latter a colored man. The police are looking for Johnson, but so far he has eluded capture.

The annual stockholders' meeting of the Chesapeake and Columbia Investment Company was held at their office in the Fleischmann Hotel, in this city, last night. Officers for the ensuing year were elected as follows: President, Thomas W. Smith; vice president, Dr. W. P. Hason; treasurer, N. H. Hise; secretary, L. Cavanagh; superintendent of the grounds, W. G. Eisinger.

COUNTY ITEMS.—A large number of new names were added to the registration books in all the districts, over a hundred in Arlington, and most of them are of white to color. It is said that the supervisors are not only going to improve the carriage road from the south end of the Long Bridge to the brick yards, but also to continue the improvement all the way to Alexandria.
