INDIAN HEAD.

Most people have heard of Indian Head, but very few appear to know much about it or even its location. That it is a tract of land owned by the Federal government somewhere in Maryland, where Uncle Sam fires off his big guns and smashes armor plate, is the very general and mystical conception of the place.

Outside of the proving ground and smokeless powder factory features, however, there are some interesting things worth knowing about Indian Head itself—that is, the town of Indian Head, if it may be so called. The fact is there is no incorporated town of that name, but there are several clusters of houses 25 miles down the Potomac river from Washington, on the Maryland shore, situated in Charles county, so designated. No one has ever been accused of calling this place a town, or even a church. It has the proud distinction, though, of fostering four railroads. The dwellings number about 30, nearly all of which are lighted by electricity, furnished with bathrooms and water and supplied with the usual modern appliances found in city houses.

There is one row of six brick houses standing alone. A strong imagination might fancy them lifted up bodily from some city and deposited here in splendid isolation. Another curious thing about Indian Head is a line of trolley cars. These are for the exclusive use of the Government, however. There are no railroad facilities for reaching Baltimore or Washington, the nearest railroad station being at La Plata, the county seat of Charles county, 15 miles away. The only means of transportation is by river steamers, and these facilities are not very ample.

Indian Head has a special reputation for malaria and the concomitant mosquito, some of which linger here even at this time of the year, and in consequence quinine is a staple drug in the community.

Over 300 government employees make their homes in and around Indian Head. Society is divided into several classes, the naval officers, of course, having an exclusive society of their own.

There are practically no private enterprises here.

The recent explosion has left things in quite a dilapidated condition. Every house in the vicinity suffered more or less. Large sections of plaster were shaken down and window sashes and doors carried away. As a consequence the houses are all open to the weather. A large curtain for glass is on, and the prospect appears good for getting the houses patched up before the very cold weather sets in.

AN UNUSUAL SUIT.

A chancery suit of unusual interest is now being heard before Judge R. R. Proatis, of the Circuit Court in Norfolk. The case is one in which three negro children of F. E. C. Rach, white, who died near Portsmouth in March last, seek to deprive Mrs. Rebecca Ann Rach, the white widow, of an estate valued at about \$20,000 which Rach owned. The deceased, who was about 60 years of age when he died, made in June, 1899, a deed by which his three negro children were to receive at his death his entire estate. Two days before he died Rach made a will leaving all of his property to his widow during her life and at her death to the negro children. Mrs. Rach now comes into court and asks that the deed made by her deceased husband to the negro children be set aside and the will sustained. Counsel for the negro children claim that both the deed and will are valid, but that after deceiving to them his property Rach had nothing to leave by will, and they ask for the entire estate. The negro children are Ernest R. Rach, about 33 years old; Emma Wright, formerly Emma Rach, about 30 years old, and Ernest Rach, about 22 years old. Their mother was Lydia Skinner, a Portsmouth negress, now dead.
