DECLARES EDEN A FICTION.
Rev. Anthony Bikovsky, pastor of the Universalist Church, Baltimore, preached Sunday morning upon "Eden Under the New Light." He said in part:

"The Eden story is a fiction—with a high purpose, but still it is only fiction. Trees of knowledge and of life, a talking snake, woman made of man's rib, God asking for information, like a committee clerk—God like a tired old gentleman walking in his garden in the cool of the evening—if we meet such a story elsewhere than in the Bible we would recognize it as fiction. Belief in the Bible does not make it fact, truth, or history. It is still a fiction and fiction, Jesus never mentions or alludes to it! Adam, Eve, Eden, Tree of Life or of Knowledge, serpent, covenant, fall of the race—none of these things did He even mention. Why? He did not believe them to be historic facts. What are the facts as the story actually sets them forth? Is Adam set before us as a character? Just the reverse is what the story says. He was a child in mind, he gave names to the animals—a child one year old could do the same; he had no provision, no foresight—neither has a child, and he could not make a garment. In morals he was equally a child, he fell at the first temptation, and that temptation was an appeal to childish appetite, something to eat. It was an equally low moral nature that when disobedience was discovered he sought to lay the blame on others; this was childish also. Man began low down, and is slowly climbing up; that is what science says; such the picture the Bible depicts—two childlike beings, naked in body, mild and alone, living in the woods with animals. Like all fiction written by genius, it has a worthy and stirring lesson for us. It has four lessons: First, the fact of human freedom; second, the fact of human responsibility for the use of our powers and opportunities; third, all knowledge may be of good and evil—man's business in life is to cling to the good and overcome the evil; fourth, work is not a curse, but a blessing. We are made for effort; we overcome the overburden with the flaming sword, and so find our life of life. Eden is here and work."
