THE SALOON-SMASHERS.

A mob of 200 men and women, armed with axes, revolvers and shotguns, yesterday totally demolished Schmidt's saloon, the finest in Winfield, Kans. Some one fired half a dozen shots from a shotgun through the front door that started a general onslaught with rocks and guns on the windows and doors. Emma Danny received a pistol ball in her face and was slightly hurt. Although this was an accident, it served to enrage the mob, and the crusaders swarmed into the saloon. There they found Charles and Henry Schmidt. After driving them from the building through the rear door the mob created havoc right and left. Cigar cases, mirrors and pictures were smashed, and those that could not be reached with axes were shot full of holes. The main bar was hacked to splinters and all the bottles and barrels were smashed. This was the work of but a few minutes. The Schmidt ran to the front door and attempted to defend their property. Rev. Charles Lowther presented Charles Schmidt from entering the place by striking him with an axe. The blow was a glancing one and made only a scalp wound. As he fell to the ground Henry Schmidt made a run for it in defense of his brother that nearly cost him his life. One of the men following up the preacher's attack had aimed an axe to strike Henry Schmidt when a companion wrested the weapon from his hands.

NO BACKBONE IN NEW YORK.

A stranger in New York asked for backbone in a restaurant the other day and was informed that the article was not known in any first-class restaurant in the town. Maybe that is so. Backbone is a winter delicacy in the South. Any southerner will tell you that backbone is hog meat. It is not all meat, of course. There is a preponderance of bone, and it comes from that part of the hog, indicated by name. The meat is tender, provided the hog has not been permitted to outlive all other hogs of the plantation. Bunning through the links which compose the bone is a kind of marrow. To the cultured palate of a southerner this marrow is the most delicate substance of the porker. It is the source of the hog. It gives the meat on the backbone a flavor which makes backbone a delicacy in the South. In ante-bellum days in that part of the country when every planter put up his own hog meat for the winter, the backbone was always taken out in its entirety when the hog was killed and salted down. When taken out and properly cooked—there is only one way to cook backbone and that is by boiling—it was a highly esteemed dish on the southern gentleman's table. Like all meats served in the South, it was brought to bed, hot from the oven. An invitation to such a dinner caused the mouth of the invited guest to water more than the memory of the best apple pie that ever gurgled past the palate. Perhaps it is as well that no New York caterer should ever try to introduce backbone. It can be prepared only in the land where it originated.
