REFUSES TO GO TO WAR.—Lieutenant the Marquis of Headfort, of the First Life Guards, whose determination to make Miss Rosa Boote, of the Gaily chorus, Marchioness of Headfort, has created so much talk, is now under orders to sail for South Africa, and is confronted with the necessity either of resigning, when told to go and fight, or giving up his fignose. He declares he will accept the stigma of resignation rather than forego his resolution to marry.

The case has been brought to the notice of no less a personage than King Edward, who handed it over to Prince Edward of Saxe-Weimar, colonel of the First Life Guard. The Prince of Saxe-Weimar wrote the young marquis a letter, pointing out the ruin of his career if he persisted in marrying Miss Boote, as she could not be received by the regiment.

The marquis replied, regretting he could not see it that way; but he sent his resignation papers to Lord Roberts. The commander-in-chief, apparently, was also involved in a little plot, for, instead of accepting his resignation, he ordered the marquis to hold himself in readiness to go to the Transvaal. The denouement is expected to be a quiet marriage and the retirement of the young peer from his majesty's service.

AFTER SCHOOLS.—There is much gossip in Richmond, Va., in regard to the probable action of the coming constitutional convention on the question of reorganizing the public school system of the State, and it is the belief of many that the body will either abolish the office of superintendent of public schools or place their election in the hands of the people. Many other questions in relation to the present school system are being discussed, notably the move to reorganize the division for school purposes, according to the tax paid by the two races. It is said that the strongest sentiment in favor of this change will probably come from the second and fourth congressional districts, where the negroes are most thickly settled. There is a suggestion that trustees be elected by the people, as well as superintendents, should the matter of reforms along this line be taken up by the convention.

MIDGET ASKS FOR DIVORCE.—In the Northumberland county, Pa., courts on Saturday, Curtis Batts, aged 35 years, and 34 inches in height, instituted proceedings for divorce from his handsome young wife, a former circus performer. He has for a number of years appeared on the vaudeville stage. Batts married his wife in Chicago, where she had become a circus rider, and soon afterward began housekeeping at Shmokin, Pa. A detective furnished him with alleged proof of her infidelity while he was upon a theatrical tour, and suit was immediately brought. She has returned to her Illinois home, and will not contest the suit.

SHE LIVED AS A MAN.—A remarkable story of male impersonation was revealed in a police court in London on Saturday in connection with arrest for alleged money frauds. The prisoner, named Catherine, a woman aged 66, described as a house decorator, appeared in the dock in male attire. For 40 years Catherine impersonated a man, and worked on board Peninsula and Oriental steamers in various capacities, and also for London firms. She says she was married at 15, taught school, and then thought there were better chances of advancement as a man. Eventually, she married a lady's maid with whom she lived for 14 years.
