JAILED BY THEIR FONS.

A sensation was caused in Winchester yesterday when Mrs. Sarah J. Parlett, wife of R. V. J. Parlett, a radical United Brethren minister, was lodged in jail at the instance of her son, William Parlett, who says his mother is insane. The unfortunate woman appears to be perfectly rational, and says her detention is the result of a conspiracy between her husband and son. Mrs. Parlett has been prominently before the public during the past year on account of the active part she took with her husband in the factional church fight between the liberal and radical branches of the United Brethren Church, which culminated in the celebrated Parlett breastpin case, in which Mrs. Parlett had a female member of the Liberal branch arrested on the charge of the larceny of an ornament. Now that the radical house is torn asunder by internal discord developments of a sensational nature are looked for. Because he feared the loss of the property that would otherwise be his, David Larson, 26 years of age, residing in Suffolk, had his mother arrested on a sensational charge in Norfolk yesterday. She stated that she had come to meet her intended husband. It appears that the mother was the proprietor of a brickyard near Suffolk that was worth \$100,000. She loved Adolphus Bunde, a Port-mouth man, and decided to marry him. The mother went to Norfolk yesterday morning and met her intended. Getting wind of the intention of the couple, the son sought to stop the marriage by heroic means. The mother tried to compromise the case with her son, but to no effect, and they were carried to Suffolk to answer the criminal charge, the groom-elect in front of Mrs. Larson's husband, who left this country several years ago, is in Denmark. Mrs. Larson, it is asserted, later agreed to make over about \$3,000 worth of property to her son, who thereupon withdrew charges and declined to appear against her and she will marry Bunde.

WAR HAS COST 14,698 LIVES.

The British losses in South Africa continue relatively high. The totals for March are: Killed—Officers, 9; men, 103; total, 112. Wounded—Officers, 26; men, 270; total, 296. The number of killed or dead of disease in the whole war up to the end of March is 694 officers and 14,004 men; a total of 14,698. The letter of General Buller, the Boer commander-in-chief, to Lord Kitchener, preliminary to the recent peace meeting proposed by Lord Kitchener is published as a Parliamentary paper. It is dated at the commandant-general's camp, February 13, and begins with a reference to "the verbal message from your Excellency." Continuing the letter says: "I have the honor to inform your Excellency that no one desires more than I do to bring this bloody strife to an end. I would also very much like to meet you. Excellency for the purpose of mutual discussion to see if it is not possible to discuss terms under which this can be done." The remainder of the letter suggests a place of meeting and arrangements for safe conduct.

Gentlemen:—In accordance with your instructions to examine and report upon the bread produced at your bakery, and the processes employed in its manufacture, I have the honor to report that I visited your bakery at Brightwood avenue and spent the major portion of three days there, carefully examining and testing the flour, yeast and doughs and critically examining the baked bread. I have no hesitation in declaring that the substances used for the bread are entirely pure and of the finest quality; and the processes by which the doughs are prepared are absolutely the most perfect in the world. This arises from the use of the special machinery of which you are the inventors and proprietors, which by making dough insure a baked loaf of ideal texture and grain, ready melting on the tongue, and free from taste and acidity. Some bread was sent to the Institute for analysis which was made by Prof. G. L. Teller, who has charge of the chemical division and who reports the following:

From a consideration of the above facts I conclude that the bread is more readily digested because of its accessibility to the digestive juices. The flavor is also increased by retaining the souring agents of fermentation by the very full oxygenation to which the dough is subjected. As the moisture was determined four days after the bread was baked, it proved the bread retains its moisture for a much longer period than is usual.
