MAY BE THE SMALLEST ENGINE.

A. G. Root, of Danbury, has just completed what is undoubtedly the smallest engine ever made. It is a horizontal engine and stands on a piece of metal exactly the size of a 10-cent piece. Mr. Root has been working at this minute piece of mechanism during his leisure time for several months. The quality of the workmanship on the tiny machine is indicated by the fact that when completed and put together, and connected with the power, it started off as nicely as the most accurately adjusted engine that was ever built.

The material of which the engine is built are gold and silver, copper and steel. The band of the fly wheel is solid gold. It will be interesting to note some of the dimensions of the parts of this very small machine. It being such a tiny affair, the measurements are all made in sixtieths, thirtieths and sixteenths of an inch. The steam chest measures 6-32x3-32, and the cylinder 8-32x3-32. The stroke is 6/64, and the extreme length of the main shaft, which is of steel, is 5/16. The diameter of the fly-wheel is 7/16, and the width of the fly-wheel band is 7/64. The diameter of the main shaft at its largest point is 3/64. The extreme length of the crank wheel is 4/16, and the diameter of the crank wheel is 6/32. The extreme outside diameter of the cylinder, which is sheathed with ebony, is 3-16 and the bore of the cylinder is 5/64. The diameter of the feed pipe, which is made of silver, is 2/32; that of the valve rod is 1/64, and that of the piston rod is less than 2/64. Completed the engine weighs three pennyweights. Mr. Root built his engine entirely by hand. The power that is now used to run it is compressed air, of which only an infinitesimal amount is needed.—[Hartford Daily Times.

A HYGIENIC DECALOGUE.

The following is taken from the Latest of February 11:

"Dr. Decornet, of Perle sur Aube, France, is announced as the winner of a prize offered by the extensive and well-known publishing house of Hachette & Co., for the ten best maxims for preserving the health, which were to be published in the Annual Almanac issued by the firm. These are the prize maxims: (1) General hygiene: Rise early, go to bed early, and in the meantime keep yourself occupied. (2) Respiratory hygiene: Water and bread sustain life, but pure air and sunlight are indispensable for health. (3) Gastro-intestinal hygiene: Frugality and sobriety are the best elixir vitae for a long life. (4) Epidermal hygiene: Cleanliness preserves from rust; the best kept machines last longest. (5) Hygiene of sleep: A sufficiency of rest repairs and strengthens; too much rest weakens and makes soft. (6) Hygiene of clothing: He is well clothed who keeps his body sufficiently warm, safeguarding it from all abrupt changes of temperature, while at the same time maintaining perfect freedom of motion. (7) Dwelling hygiene: A house that is clean and cheerful makes a happy home. (8) Moral hygiene: The mind reposes and resumes its edge by means of relaxation and amusement, but excess opens the door to these passions, and these attract the vices. (9) Intellectual hygiene: Gayety conduces to love of life, and love of life is the half of health; on the other hand, sadness and gloom help on old age. (10) Professional hygiene: If it is your brain that feeds you, don't allow your arms and legs to become anachronous. Do you dig for a livelihood, don't omit to burnish your intellect and elevate your thoughts."
