WILL PENSION HER HUSBAND.—The application for a divorce and alimony filed by William Bernard, who married a wealthy widow some time ago, was heard Friday. During the trial it developed that Mrs. Bernard proposed marriage to her husband. After marriage she paid him a regular annual income of \$150 a year. She made him do the chores and assist in the washing. When he rebelled she shot him in the foot. She gave him a riding horse, overcoat and umbrella, which he pawned. In court she said her husband "was only a dude; indolent, loving, gentle, deceitful, persuasive, stealthy and soft." When the testimony was all in the judge decided that Bernard was not entitled to a divorce, but should have alimony. The amount was fixed at \$1 a year for every year Bernard has lived. His first payment will be \$48, the next \$44 and so on, as long as he lives. Mrs. Bernard has the option of taking or declining a divorce.

THE NICARAGUA CANAL.—The London Spectator commenting on the subject of the Nicaragua canal says: "Undoubtedly we hold all the diplomatic trumpets, but the United States Senate may be relied upon to behave in the most objectionable and indelicate way possible from the standpoint of diplomacy. If we insist on the Clayton-Bulwer treaty rights, either the canal will not be dug or the Senate will destroy the Clayton-Bulwer treaty. As the canal will be operated exclusively by Americans, does any one suppose that, treaty or no treaty, any power at war with America would be able to use the waterway?"
