THE NEW POTOMAC BRIDGE.

The board of engineer officers appointed by Secretary Root on March 22 to select a site, formulate plans, specifications and estimates for a passenger bridge across the Potomac to replace the Long Bridge and to be located within 500 feet of that structure, has practically completed its report and will submit it to the Secretary of War within a short time.

The bill passed by Congress on February 12 authorizing the Secretary of War to enter into a contract with the Baltimore and Potomac Railroad Company to construct this highway bridge. The sum of \$768,000 has been appropriated and the structure must be completed by February 13, 1903.

The plans favored by the engineer board will make the bridge cost just \$568,030 and provide for a steel structure resting on masonry piers. There will be seven spans, each 250 feet long and two spans, each 200 feet long, with a draw-bridge span, 250 feet. This will give the bridge proper a total length of 2,400 feet.

There will be nine piers and two abutments of masonry. The draw pier will contain 1,840 cubic yards of masonry. The floor of the bridge will consist of steel plates, covered with asphalt. The piers will be 115 feet apart from those of the Long Bridge and will leave the danger of the ice-jams which cause floods. The draw will be sixty-eight feet wider than that on the old Long Bridge, and will lessen the liability of accidents.

The new structure will be located about 500 feet above the present bridge. The approach at the north end will consist of a causeway paved with stone, with a 100-foot bridge over the outer lock. At the south end the causeway will be paved with stone. The draw-bridge will be modern in every respect, and will contain a very powerful set of machinery.

This bridge is to be used only for highway traffic, the Baltimore and Potomac Railroad Company being required to replace the Long Bridge with a steel railroad bridge within four years. The highway bridge will be open for the use of all street railroad companies chartered by Congress. The Washington, Alexandria, and Mount Vernon Railroad company is required to cease operating on the Long Bridge and to lay its tracks on the new structure. No overhead wires will be permitted and an underground electric system must be laid. Each street will be required to pay its own share of the cost of the bridge. The cost of the structure will be divided between the District of Columbia and the United States government—each to pay one-half of the sum of \$568,000.

The wagon travel from the south will not be inconvenienced by the change in the bridges, as the approach to the new structure, being only 500 feet above the Long Bridge, will not materially increase the distance traveled by teams. The distance between the new bridge and the Long Bridge will enable the authorities to break up the ice between the two structures and to prevent any jam.

The Engineer Board is at present tasting the bottom of a route 600 feet above the Long Bridge and as soon as the exact distance can be learned wherein there is a safe foundation, the report will be submitted to Secretary Root, who will work on the structure will begin as soon as Secretary Root formally adopts the report and accepts the plans.
