WASHED AWAY BY FLOODS.

The railroads in South Carolina and a dozen cotton mills have been put out of business by the recent floods.

The Carolina and Northern, the Seaboard Air Line from Monroe, N. C., to Atlanta, and the Charleston and Atlantic division of the Southern cannot operate trains.

The South Carolina extension, the old "Three C's," cannot even do local business on two hundred miles of line.

The Carolina and Northwestern lost 3 miles of track near Hickory. Alongside of this road had just been built a modern summer resort hotel.

Thursday night, near Columbia, the middle section of the trestle over Cedar creek went down just as a train passed; another passenger train following stopped just in the nick of time.
