LOCAL MATTERS.

WEATHER PROBABILITIES.—For this section fair tonight and probably Tuesday; light variable winds.

SUPPOSED BURGLAR ARRESTED.—George Wilson, charged with two burglaries, one at Washington and Ohio Junction and another at Waterloo, Alexandria county, was captured in Baltimore Saturday.

WILSON WAS PHOTOGRAPHED IN BALTIMORE and a copy of the picture sent Major Sylvester in Washington. As soon as the picture was received the manager of the Phillips-Jackson Brick Company was sent for and identified the man worn by John L. Norton, the bookkeeper of the company, which was stolen last week.

THE CRIMES WITH WHICH WILSON is charged were committed last Tuesday night, the particulars of which were published in the Gazette. John A. Crowley, a telegraph operator, reported Wednesday morning about 4 o'clock that his signal box near the Washington and Ohio Junction at St. Elmo, had been entered and robbed, and that he had followed the man alleged to have committed the theft to Washington.

THE POLICE WERE THOUGHT TO LOOK FOR the burglar, but he escaped detection, and left Washington for Baltimore on an early morning train. Later in the morning Inspector Boardman learned that the office of the Phillips-Jackson Brick Company, at Waterloo, had been entered during the night and \$30 in cash, with a mackintosh and hat, had been taken.

THE MAN WAS THE PROPERTY OF the bookkeeper, John L. Norton, and it was reported, could be very easily identified by five holes that had been punched in the front of the crown. The reports of both burglaries were sent to the Baltimore police, and the man apprehended as stated. Wilson told the Baltimore authorities that he was a steam fitter by trade, and that he was on his way north from his home in Columbia, S. C., to secure work when the robberies occurred.

HE DENIED HAVING COMMITTED ANY CRIME, and denied having committed any crime. At least two men saw the burglar and can identify him. Wilson will be brought to Alexandria county.

DEATHS AND FUNERALS.—Mr. James Bradley, an old and well-known resident, died yesterday afternoon at his home, 413 Queen street, after a protracted illness. The deceased is survived by a widow and eight grown children.

MR. BRADLEY WAS A NATIVE OF IRELAND, and came to this country when young, and in the outbreak of the civil war joined the Confederate army. At the close of the war he returned to this city, where he engaged in his trade, the tailoring business. An account of ill health the deceased had not for several years followed his vocation. The funeral will take place from St. Mary's Catholic Church tomorrow morning at 9:30 o'clock.

MISS MARY KNOTT DIED SUDDENLY at 6:30 o'clock yesterday evening at the residence of Mr. John O'Leary, corner of Royal and Prince streets. Heart disease is supposed to have been the cause of her death. The deceased came to this city from Glymont, Md., several years ago.

THE FUNERAL OF THE LATE MRS. EDWARD Cowling, whose death occurred on Thursday last, took place at 2 o'clock this afternoon from her late residence in West End. The interment was in the Ivy Hill Cemetery. Rev. Dr. Wallis officiated.

LATHA WILLIAMS, colored, living in the northwestern section of the city, was paralyzed Saturday night and died early Sunday morning. The deceased was well-known and respected by all who knew her. She had been for years employed as nurse by different families in this city, and was serving in that capacity at the residence of Mr. W. J. Boothe when stricken. She was removed to her home, where, as stated above, she soon died.

DROWNED AT FOUR MILE RUN.—While fishing from boat at Four Mile Run, a short distance east of this city, last night, Frank Jarret, of North Eckington, D. C. was drowned. Magistrate Walter U. Varney was notified but an inquest was deemed unnecessary.

JARRET WAS IN THE BOAT WITH A Mr. Eret, of Oalook, Alexandria county. While passing through the south arch at the run about nine o'clock the tide was coming in rapidly, and the unfortunate man got up for the purpose of getting an oar to pull the boat through the arch, and in so doing, lost his balance and fell overboard. At the time there were two other men in a boat going through the other arch. Jarret came down to the run about noon yesterday, accompanied by several friends, for the purpose of fishing and had concluded his trip when the accident occurred. Shortly after his friend Eret notified those on shore of the accident, Mr. James T. Galloway set out in a boat and with a grasping iron fished the body out and brought it ashore. The deceased was about twenty-four years of age, and unmarried, and was a bricklayer by trade. The remains were brought to Mr. B. Whealy's undertaker's establishment and this morning were sent to Washington.

MEETINGS.—A meeting of Catholic ladies was held at St. Mary's Hall yesterday afternoon to introduce into Alexandria a ladies' branch of the Catholic Benevolent Legion. Miss Anna O'Connell, of New York, explained the methods of the organization and preliminaries for the extension of the legion here were made. Rev. Fathers Cutler and Abern made addresses. Preliminary arrangements for the organization were made and a number of applications for membership were filed. A permanent organization will be formed in a few weeks.

THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE FATHER Mathew Total Abstinence Society was held last night when the annual officers were elected for the ensuing year: Spiritual Director, Rev. H. J. Cutler; president, J. P. Laphen; treasurer, William Desmond; recording secretary, W. J. McFarland; corresponding secretary, George A. Harlow. Rev. Father H. J. Cutler and others delivered addresses. There was a large attendance of members.

FELL FROM HIS ENGINE.—George Valentine, twenty-four years of age, a fireman in the employ of the Pennsylvania Railroad, was seriously injured shortly after 6:30 o'clock Saturday evening by being thrown from his engine at Bush Hill, a short distance south of this city. Valentine is a native of Wilmington, D. C. Shortly after 5 o'clock Saturday evening the freight on which he was aboard pulled out with Engineer Williams at the throttle. When near Bush Hill Valentine noticed that his supply of coal was low. Seizing a small iron pick he climbed upon the tender to shove the coal nearer the mouth of the furnace, so that it could be more easily shoveled. As he was about to step down again his foot caught in something, and he was thrown from his engine. Engineer Williams brought the train to a stop as soon as possible, and Valentine was picked up in an unconscious condition. His head was badly crushed, and he was suffering from internal injuries of a serious nature. He was later taken to Washington. His condition is said to be serious.

DRUNKEN AND DISORDERLY CHARACTERS.—The extreme southwestern section of the city was the scene of more disorderly conduct yesterday—not an unusual occurrence in that locality on Sundays. There were numbers drunk and in one instance a colored woman was knocked down with a brick thrown by a male member of her race. There was said to be more than an average number of drunken or semi-drunken people on the streets yesterday.

FIGHTING EXCURSIONISTS.—When the steamer Samuel J. Peniz arrived about 11 o'clock Saturday night two young men came ashore and began to settle some difficulty they had aboard by a fistful. Officer Knight was on hand and brought the fight to a close by arresting the belligerents. One of them left collateral for his appearance this morning, but he failed to answer when the case was called. The other man was dismissed.

THE KING STREET IMPROVEMENT is being pushed as rapidly as possible by the contractor, Messrs. Cavillier & Spinks. The work of laying the sewer is approaching completion, and paying will soon be commenced. The improved rails to be used by the railroad company have arrived.

HAIL STORM.—A number of officers of the steamer Wakefield, which arrived from the lower river landings yesterday evening, report a heavy hail storm at Dill's wharf and vicinity on Saturday. Considerable damage was done the wheat crops.

LOCAL BREVITIES.—A boy named George Wilkins fell overboard from the Norfolk steamers' wharf yesterday evening, but was rescued by bystanders. Messrs. Hamilton & Co. will soon have a handsome new front put in their clear factory on King street. Messrs. Brenner and Knight will do the work.

THE ALEXANDRIA COUNTY COURT on Saturday adjourned until next Saturday, when some minor business will be transacted and court will adjourn for the term.

ANOTHER INJUNCTION.—Judge Nicol in the Circuit Court of Alexandria today at Fairfax sustained the demurrer for the Board of Police Commissioners in the first injunction proceedings instituted by Mayor Simpson restraining the members of the board from putting into operation sections 56 and 59 of the rules governing the police force. This virtually dissolved the injunction. Mr. Johnson, counsel for the Mayor, however, presented a new bill in which the Mayor asks that the "Police Board be restrained" and not Messrs. Hill, Prior, Bryant and Miller, as individuals named in the original bill. Thereupon Judge Nicol awarded an injunction upon the new bill. To this bill the Police Commissioners will file their answer and the matter be submitted to the judge for a decision upon the merits of the case.

YESTERDAY WAS AN IDEAL SUMMER Sunday. The day broke clear and mild, but by noon the temperature was warm. In the afternoon the mercury climbed to a high degree, but later clouds appeared in the southwestern heavens, and by the time services in the churches began there was a shower with some thunder and lightning.
