A GRUBBING WAGER.—A strange wager, which cannot be decided while either of the parties to it are alive, has just been made by two of the best known men in the Ohio oil field—John Steiner and Bert Bowley. The making of the bet at Bucyrus, Ohio, resulted from an argument relating to the size of the two men. Steiner is over six feet five inches in height and weighs 346 pounds. Bowley is smaller, being six feet, two inches in height and weighs 202 pounds. There was no dispute about the actual size of the men, but Mr. Bowley claimed that his skeleton was much larger than the frame work on which Steiner's body was built. This brought on a heated argument, which resulted in each man putting up \$100 that his skeleton weighed the more. When either of the men dies his skeleton is to be secured and carefully weighed. The same proceeding is to follow the death of the other, and the money is to be paid to the winner from the estate of the one who loses the money. It is said that the oil drillers' hospital fund. Steiner comes from a family of giants living near Bluffton.
