ENORMOUS COST OF EMPIRE
The official figures of the cost of the South African War from 1899 to 1902 are given by the British Chancellor of the Exchequer as \$714,035,000. This total embraces all that has been spent up to the present time and all that will be spent, according to recent estimates, to the end of the fiscal year in 1902. The war in China from 1900 to 1902 is estimated to cost \$28,300,000, the aggregate of two wars carried on at the same time with \$24,250,000 of interest added being \$768,585,000. This does not include the cost of two other wars which have begun and ended while fighting was in progress in South Africa and China—namely, the formidable war in Ashanti and the military expedition in Somaliland. These together can hardly have cost less than \$9,000,000. From which it appears that the burden imposed on British taxpayers by actual fighting in three years is over \$775,000,000. Empire is doubtless a brilliant thing, but it comes high at this price.

In his recent speech in the Commons in defense of his proposals Sir Michael Hicks-Beach gave his idea of the meaning of the present conflict, which implied a "die" at Mr. Gladstone and his "magnanimity" in 1881 "We are now," he said, "suffering from the mistake of Mejuba and repairing the loss of prestige due to that ignominious retreat. As soon as the recent ultimatum was delivered it was clear that a question which was solved the wrong way in 1881 had to be solved in the right way, that South Africa should be lost to us and the disintegration of the Empire should begin." The official view, it thus appears, was that the issue raised by the ultimatum was larger than South Africa, involving the whole Empire. The United States may find in this recital good reason for avoiding the entanglements of extended empire.—(Baltimore Sun.)

FELL VICTIM TO CANNIBALS.—The Berlin Tageblatt prints special correspondence from New Guinea containing a full account of the massacre of the members of the first German South Sea expedition on the cannibal islands of St. Matthias. They were all killed and eaten, save a Dr. Heinrich.

The Colonial Zeitung, the official organ of the German Colonial Society, furnishes details of the massacre. It seems that the vessel which carried the expedition to the island of St. Matthias after a few days for Herbertshoh, New Britain, to get coal and fresh supplies. During its absence the savages, who had hitherto appeared friendly, although known to be rabid cannibals, planned to kill and rob the diminished party. The plot was carried out one morning while the members of the expedition, who had a body-guard of forty drilled Papuans, were cleaning their rifles, which they had taken apart. Suddenly eighty of the islanders broke from the bushes, raising fierce war cries and brandishing spears, with which they stabbed to death the leader of the party, Dr. Mencken (heretofore called as Mencke or Mencke), his secretary, Herr Carr, and a white sailor who was asleep under a tent. Dr. Heinrich emptied his revolver into his assailants, while the body-guard, in the meantime, retired to the boats with the wounded and Dr. Heinrich, leaving twelve dead. The boat put off to an island not far distant, where the expeditionary vessel rescued them. Subsequently the survivors returned to the island of St. Matthias, where they found that the bodies had been devoured and the camp absolutely looted.



OFFICIAL. TO THE OWNERS OF DOGS: Mayor's Office, Alexandria, Va., June 1, 1901.

All persons owning or intending to keep any animal of the Dog or Canine species must come forward on or before JUNE TWELFTH, 1901, and take out a license for the same from the Auditor. After the 12th of June all persons owning or harboring dogs without the required license will be fined (as the laws on subject require) \$5 for every dog so owned or harbored.

Complaint has been frequently made that many persons fail to take out their licenses, and that others pay on one or two dogs when owning and harboring more, or who send such dogs away during the summer months and bring them back in the fall. My attention has been called to this evasion of the law, and I shall require the petitioner to report all such cases, and fines will be imposed upon those who fail to take out licenses.
