PROPAGATION OF FISH.

Superintendent Chester K. Green, of the government fish propagating pond, in Washington, makes an interesting report concerning the work of hatching and preparing for shipment of large-mouth black bass and crappie, sometimes called "bitter heads." The superintendent says there is such a striking similarity in shape and color between the crappie and strawberry, or calico bass, that the former are often mistaken by anglers for the species of bass mentioned.

The hatching season for bass and crappie is ended, and several of the larger ponds are now swarming with young fish of sufficient growth for transportation. The shipment of bass, in lots ranging from 300 to 1,500, usually continues until January. Last season 65,000 large-mouth black bass were sent from the ponds to various points, on requisition from the fish commission. Superintendent Green says this season's hatch has been unusually successful, and not less than the number recorded last season will be shipped this year. There are a great many beds and young fry in the ponds, he says, and the outlook is hopeful. He also expects that about 1,500 young crappie will be distributed. The crappie were first placed in the government fish pond in 1888. These fish are not so tame as bass, but they are an excellent fish and very prolific. They are indigenous to the eastern States, from the great lakes to Texas, and west of Kansas and Nebraska. They thrive in rivers and ponds.

Superintendent Green says there are some crappie in the Potomac in this vicinity, as grown fish of this species are known to have come into the government ponds to spawn early in the season. It is understood that local anglers will have a lot of the bass and crappie placed in the Potomac this season.

THROUGH NIAGARA'S RAPIDS.—

On Thursday afternoon a man named Chambers, accompanied by a companion, arrived at Niagara from Buffalo. They made their way to the gorge, going to a point on the New York side, just below the outlet of the whirlpool. This is below the fiercest part of the Niagara rapids. The men carried a life boat and a life preserver, and these Chambers tied about his body. He then leaped into the river and went down stream. The buoy and life preserver were sufficient to keep him well up out of the water, and now and then his progress was aided by strong swimming. Passengers on a car on the electric scenic line watched him as he was dashed about by the waves. It was on this portion of the river that Peter Nielsen's boat was wrecked after he sent it out of the whirlpool. In places the rocks lie close to the surface and dangerous ledges run far out in the river. But Chambers avoided all dangers and successfully swam the river to a point between the Devil's Hole and Lewiston. Why he performed the feat was not made clear by him. The men returned to Buffalo Saturday night.


