THE SCHLEY INVESTIGATION.

The request made by Rear Admiral Schley regarding the matter of the alleged interview given by Rear Admiral Howison to a reporter of the Boston Record has been denied by the Navy Department. Rear Admiral Howison will not be asked by the department as to whether or not he made the statement attributed to him saying that Schley is not respected as Sampson is, and that the glory of the battle of Santiago belongs to Sampson.

Whether or not, in view of the alleged statement, Admiral Howison is to remain a member of the naval tribunal which is to hear and determine Admiral Schley's case is, as presaged in the Gazette's Washington correspondence yesterday, to be left to the determination of the court itself, of which he is constituted a member.

Acting Secretary Hackett yesterday made public the correspondence in the matter, including his own reply to the request of Admiral Schley, in which he declines to forward a copy of the alleged interview to Admiral Howison for his confirmation or denial. Instead, he states in his letter to Admiral Schley that he has sent the correspondence upon the subject to Admiral Dewey as president of the court of inquiry.

Admiral Schley, in his letter to Acting Secretary Hackett, did not request the removal of Admiral Howison from the court, but merely called the reported statements to the attention of the department and asked that the matter be referred to Admiral Howison, and requested that a copy of the latter's answer be sent him.

Notwithstanding the fact that Admiral Schley expresses high regard for Admiral Howison, the department is acting upon the matter construed as a challenge against Admiral Howison sitting upon the court. Taking this view of the case, Mr. Hackett has argued, as he did in the matter of the list of witnesses, that the court had been constituted and accepted by Admiral Schley, and that the matter had passed out of the hands of the department, strictly speaking, and is now in the hands of the court itself.

The body which is to determine whether or not Admiral Schley is guilty of "prejudicial conduct," and the other charges made against him, is also to decide as to the qualifications of its members, who are to pass judgment.


