



DESPERATE FIGHT WITH CONVICTS.

Seven of the 26 convicts who escaped from the stockade of the new Federal Prison at Leavenworth, Kan., Thursday afternoon have been accounted for. Two of the seven are dead—James Hoffman, aged 20, and J. J. Poffenbain, aged 25, a soldier convict.

Willard Drake, aged 19, is wounded and recaptured; Fred Moore, aged 16, a negro, is recaptured, unharmed; John Green, wounded, and Donald Norris and R. L. Davenport were found in a ravine near Jarbale.

The first-named five men were discovered in the barn of Ely Weishaar, near Nortonville, about 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon. Weishaar went into the barn and was ordered out at the point of guns. He rushed to Nortonville and gathered a posse, who with pistols, shotguns and a few Winchester pistols, followed him. The convicts saw the posse coming and rushed from the barn. They had two shotguns and pistols. The posse pursued them and a running fight resulted. The convicts were at a disadvantage and their shots had no effect, while at every volley from the posse one of the convicts fell. After two of them had dropped the other two gave themselves up, one being wounded, the other unharmed. The fifth was fully 250 yards away when a man with a Winchester fired. He evidently had been hit, but tried to go on. A volley was fired at him and he fell dead. None of the posse was hurt.

Quinn Fort, who was killed Thursday, was 19 years old. One of the convicts killed is a military prisoner and the others are serving terms for robbery or assault. One is an Indian and two are negroes. Nearly all came from Oklahoma and Indian Territories and they are supposed to be making for that country. They are hardy men, used to firearms and horses. Some have obtained both, but others are on foot and defenseless.

Warden McClaughey says he will capture every one of the men. In the districts around the city every road and river crossing that the fugitives might use is guarded by armed men, the farmers having turned out to earn the \$50 reward now being paid for the return of each convict. These of the men who are armed are likely to be shot on sight. It develops that the mutiny was planned several months ago, but that the men had never found a favorable opportunity to carry it into effect until yesterday. The general plan was not new, but it proved effective because of the limited number of guards. As the better behaved prisoners are used in the outside work the conspiracy was hatched among the men in the inside gang.

The convicts chose the most favorable moment of the day, while many of the guards acting as foremen of construction of the new cellhouse were unarmcd.

The convicts captured at Lawrence were Oie Babo, a half-breed Indian, and Joseph H. Deekin, a soldier serving a term for desertion and assault to kill. Frank Thompson, the negro desperado who led the outbreak, is supposed to be near Lawrence heavily armed. He will probably not be taken alive.

CAUSE OF LI HUNG CHANG'S DEATH.
A violent dispute with M. Paul Lessor, Russian minister to China, over the Manchurian treaty seems to have been the immediate cause of Li Hung Chang's death.

The diplomatic events preceding this tragic climax have enabled Japan for a moment to frustrate the design of Russia. A fortnight ago the Japanese legation secured a reliable outline of the treaty's terms and demanded that the Chinese plenipotentiaries officially declare the text, basing this demand upon the allegation that Japanese interests were involved in any change of the status of Manchuria.

The Chinese plenipotentiaries refused to comply with the demand. Then the Russian government from Tokio communicated with the southern viceroys and induced them to use their influence with the Empress Dowager against the treaty. In the meantime the Empress Dowager instructed Li Hung Chang to communicate the treaty, after certain modifications, to the minister of the powers, and, if they did not object, to sign it.

Li Hung Chang visited M. Lessor and explained to him the instructions. The Russian minister strongly objected to revealing the text of the treaty to the ministers of the other powers and a stormy interview ensued. Li went home in a violent passion and had a hemorrhage, which the doctors attribute to the overexertion of a weakened system.
