NATIVES FED TO CANNIBALS. - Capt. Guy Barrows, who has just returned from the employ of the Congo Free State government after six years' service, declared in an interview in London yesterday that the conditions prevailing in the Congo Free State are a disgrace to civilization...

"I have worn testimony," said Barrows, "of the Belgians handling over captives to cannibal tribes for the express purpose of being eaten. Forced labor prevails everywhere and 'whitening' is the truest description of the present administration. The companies deriving wealth from the collection of rubber are all more or less state enterprises, as a third or half of the shares in them are invariably held by the government, latterly King Leopold and the government have made some show of action against the agents of some of the upper Congo companies, but only minor officials are ever touched, and the so-called reforms are merely intended to throw dust in the eyes of the public, whose indignation has been aroused by the stories of this reign of terror. While the present systems for the collection of rubber and the recruitment of natives continue the Congo Free State will remain a disgrace to the white man's work in Africa."

The doctor was unable to go, but he sent a brief synopsis of his paper, in which he explained he had been disappointed in not obtaining the actual brain, but that during the four and one-half hours the body was under dissection he had time to make the cast.
