### KAISER'S GIFTS TO PRESIDENT.

The gifts sent by Kaiser Wilhelm to President Roosevelt arrived on the train on Monday with the Prince, and were at once delivered at the German Embassy. These gifts intended for the President were first to be unpacked and sent to the White House. The largest of these was a life-size bronze bust of the German Emperor, showing him in full dress uniform as Commander-in-Chief of the German army, of his cloak thrown back, showing the breast of his uniform literally covered with royal orders. On his head is the helmet surmounted by the golden imperial eagle. The second gift was a life-size, full-length portrait of Prince Henry, in full dress naval uniform. This was appropriately framed in a massive gold setting. The third gift was a handsome engraved great-great-grandfather of the President to the President of the United States. This parchment, three feet in height, was framed in gold with a large imperial crown of Germany surmounting it at the top. These gifts were at once upon arrival placed in the State dining room, where they were viewed and admired by the company at the conclusion of the dinner yesterday evening.

Before the luncheon given on the imperial yacht Hohenzollern at New York yesterday in honor of President Roosevelt by Prince Henry a golden ornament with a picture of Kaiser Wilhelm in diamonds presented to the President by Alice Roosevelt. It was the emperor's gift to the young lady as sponsor for the yacht Mitosor. The presentation was made by Prince Henry on behalf of his brother, the emperor. The prince made a brief address and the young lady thanked him very much. The bracelet is of very handsome workmanship and the portrait of the emperor in diamonds is well made.

### ALLEGED WIFE MURDERER.

The search for Joseph Wilfred Blondie, suspected of murdering his wife, whose bodiless head was found near Chelmsford, Mass., last June, came to an end yesterday morning, when a man, possibly Blondie, was identified by Chief of Police Watts, of Boston, and witnesses brought by him from Boston for the purpose, was captured in New York. This fugitive from justice, who has for nine months eluded the police of every eastern city of this country and of Canada, was arrested yesterday morning in the entry way of police headquarters, where he had gone to take out an engineer's license. The police believe he has been in New York ever since his flight from Massachusetts. Blondie has been a fugitive since June 9, when the headless body of his wife was found in the woods at Chelmsford, Mass. Two days later the missing portion was found in a brook some six miles away from the place where the body had been. The police learned that Mrs. Blondie and her husband had been living in a lodging house in Boston. Subsequent investigations disclosed evidence which led to the theory that in a fit of passion due to jealousy, the woman's husband had strangled her, and concealing the body in a trunk, had taken it to Chelmsford at night. To prevent identification it was thought the head was cut off and thrown into the brook and the body hidden in the woods.

### MILLIONAIRE'S WILL.

The will of the millionaire jeweler, Charles A. Tiffany, filed for probate in New York yesterday, gives an estate of several millions chiefly to his widow, Harriet O. Tiffany, and two children, Barnett Tiffany, one of his sons, is provided for in a codicil which reads: "My observation of the character of my son, Barnett T. Tiffany, convinces me that it may be greatly to his disadvantage that he be in receipt of income exceeding what is actually necessary for his support and maintenance, and I am desirous that, for his own benefit, my executors should from time to time decide whether, in their opinion, his life has expenditures to justify a larger or less income, as the case may be. \* \* \* In my opinion unless a radical change shall take place in his life and habits, the sum of \$5,000 per annum, payable in monthly installments, will be ample amount for his proper support and maintenance."

### STRUNG UP HIS WIFE AS A JOKE.

A celebration following a christening in Rock Island, Ill., yesterday came near ending in tragedy. While the hilarity was at its height, one of the merry-makers, a large and powerful man, seized his young wife and carried her into the yard. Finding there a rope, he placed one end of it about her neck, and, throwing the other over the limb of a tree, without more ado drew her into the house and confined to a number of friends the nature of the joke he had played on his better half. Some of the more sober ones thought best to investigate, and found, to their horror, that the playful husband had tied the truth. They cut the woman down and restored her to consciousness by the use of stimulants.




