THE WORK OF FINAL REVISION.
The work of the committee on final revision of the constitutional convention may prove more difficult and require much longer time than has been anticipated. The task of adjustment and reconciling the various articles, sections and clauses will be comparatively simple as this part of the work is circumscribed within well defined limits, but the trouble will come over preparing the schedule by which the constitution will be put in operation, the time its provisions as to new officers shall go into effect and the appointment of the 1,500 or more registrars provided for in the suffrage article.

It has been tentatively agreed by the committee that all officers, such as county judges, clerks, etc., will be elected to hold over until January 1, 1901, and those officers, such as sheriffs, treasurers, etc., whose terms would otherwise expire in July, 1903 will be extended until January 1, 1904, upon new bonds being given. It had been mooted for several days before the convention adjourned that this tacit understanding among certain members of the committee was not satisfactory to a considerable majority, who were not willing to wait until 1904 before beginning to feel the beneficial effect of the new constitution, after it was adopted.

Since the understanding, too, the convention has adopted two measures that will materially complicate the situation not only as regards the conclusion of the Revision Committee, but as to the acceptance by the convention of the report of the committee, should only a majority report be submitted.

The last act of the convention requires the election of all State Senators once in four years.

MISCELLANEOUS.
A new, revised edition of the Postal Laws and Regulations, edited up to January 14, will be issued by the Post-office Department next week. The edition will number 110,000, and will be delivered to those using it at the rate of five thousand a day. Revision and editing of the Postal Laws is made about every ten years.

An order has been issued by the Post office Department forbidding the use of the mails to the People's Supply House, Chicago, for fraudulent use of the mails. The scheme of this concern was to send circulars through the mails offering employment on a commission basis to all who applied. Persons answering were informed that they must send fifty cents for further information. Then they received a fountain pen, with instructions to write letters to their friends and receive a commission for each sale.
