BRYAN AND THE HARMONY DINER.

The absence of Mr. William J. Bryan from the recent Tilden Club harmony meeting at New York is explained by a statement made by Mr. Bryan yesterday evening, commenting on the meeting.

As the cause of Mr. Bryan says there is no such thing as democratic harmony where ex-President Cleveland is concerned. He continues: "The target given on the evening of June 19 by the Tilden Club of New York city was advertised as a harmony meeting, but it turned out to be what might have been expected of such a gathering—an ovation to the chief guest, former democrat Grover Cleveland. There can be no such thing as harmony between men like him and those who believe in democratic principles, and he is frank enough to say so. He spent no time looking for middle ground upon which to gather together discordant elements. He boldly called upon the members of the party to abandon their convictions and to accept the construction which he placed upon democratic principles. He even lauded the party with being a sort of prodigal son and invited it to give up its diet of huss and return to its father's house."

"He spoke of his retirement from political activity" and said: "Perhaps there are those who would define my position as one of banishment instead of retirement. Against this I shall not enter a protest. It is sufficient for me in either case that I have followed on the matters of difference within our party the teachings and counsel of the great democrat in whose name party peace and harmony are tonight invoked. 
