## THE LOUDOUN CAMP MEETING

The Loudoun Camp Meeting Association will begin its fifth annual encampment August 15, and continue to the 25th inclusive, at its grounds near Leithton, situated on a high elevation in the most beautiful and picturesque part of that grand old county, commanding a lovely view of the Blue Ridge six miles away and the surrounding country. There are now some thirty tents completed, and more in progress, among them three large boarding tents, where accommodations can be had at moderate prices. In fact all the necessities for either man or beast can be had on the grounds. The committee has gone to considerable expense in boring two wells over one hundred feet deep, from which an abundance of pure cold water will be had free of cost. This encampment has long been pronounced the largest in the State. Dr. J. W. Duffey, presiding elder, will have charge of the religious exercises. Bishop Wilson will preach at 11 a. m. and 3 p. m. the 1st Sunday. The place of Bishop Chandler, who was unavoidably kept away, will be filled by Dr. W. V. Tudor of Richmond, one of the most able divines of the Virginia Conference, an excellent substitute, one well suited to the people of the county, having preached there in former years. There will also be other able divines, among them E. V. Register, of Baltimore; C. D. Harris, of Martinsburg; J. P. Stump, of Alexandria, and others. Rev. S. G. Ferguson will preach to the old Confederate soldiers, Wednesday the 20th. The committees have made ample provision for the comfort of all in attendance, and they look forward to this being the largest and best meeting they have ever had, and to defray the necessary expense, there will be collected at the gates a fee of five cents from all persons of the age of ten years and over, except on Sundays when a fee of ten cents will be collected; children under ten years free.

## WANTS TO SPRING THE TRAP.—Con-

siderable interest is manifested throughout Georgia regarding the request made by Mrs. Ella Hall, of Berrien county, to the sheriff that she be permitted to spring the trap at the execution of Boney Bryant, the murderer of her father. Public opinion is greatly divided and the governor may be asked to interfere. Mrs. Hall, when seen, frankly admitted that it is both her wish and intention to spring the death trap of Bryant, and not only that but also to cut down his body when life shall have become extinct. "Are you not afraid your nerve will fail you at the scaffold?" she was asked. "No," was her reply. "I am as tender hearted about other things as most women are, but in this case it is different. Bryant killed my father in cold blood and I want to kill him." Mrs. Hall said that when her father died she was unconscious from worry and grief, or she would have insisted that her father's friends lynch Bryant then and there. She has no doubt, she said, that if she had made the request it would have been carried.

## Alexandria City Bonds

For Sale.

The City Treasurer will receive sealed bids for the new issue of Alexandria city bonds, for any part thereof, up to and including August 30, 1902.

The denominations of these bonds are as follows: Twenty bonds of one thousand (1,000) dollars each; forty bonds of five hundred (500) dollars each; one hundred bonds of one hundred (100) dollars each, making a total issue of fifty thousand (50,000) dollars.

These are four per cent (4 per cent) coupon bonds, bearing date on July 1, 1902, the interest being payable January 1 and July 1 of each year, and the principal being payable July 1, 1932, and are not taxable by the city.

The issue of these bonds was authorized by an act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved March 28, 1902, and all the requirements of this act have been fully and strictly observed.

Bids should be addressed to THOMAS W. ROBINSON, City Treasurer, Alexandria, Va., and should be marked "Bids for City Bonds." All bids will be opened at 11 o'clock a. m. on Monday, September 1, 1902, and the right is reserved to reject any and all bids.

In making bids the accumulated interest from July 1, 1902, should be taken into consideration.

A certified check for 3 per cent of the par value of the bonds shall be enclosed with each bid, which sum shall be forfeited to the city of Alexandria in case of refusal or omission on the part of the successful bidder to accept the bonds and make payment for the same within two weeks following the awarding of the same.
