## CUNARD COMPANY SUBSIDIZED.

The Cunard Line has agreed with the British government to accept a subsidy of \$750,000 a year. Two new boats are to be built on a government loan, which is to be repaid in twenty years. The company will pay the interest on the loan at the rate of 2 1/2 per cent per annum. One of the conditions imposed by the government is that the ships of the line must retain their British registry. Lord Inverclyde, chairman of the Cunard Steamship Company, has issued a circular to the shareholders, giving the details of the company's agreement with the government. It shows that the two large steamers that the company is to build for the Atlantic trade are to have a high rate speed. The agreement is to remain in force for twenty years from the completion of the second of the steamers. The company pledges itself to remain a purely British undertaking. It will hold its whole fleet at the disposal of the government, which is at liberty to purchase any or all the steamers at agreed rates. The company agrees not to raise the freights unduly or to give preference rates to foreigners. Mr. Gerald Balfour, president of the London board of trade, in a speech this evening at Sheffield, indicated that the two new Cunard steamers will exceed in speed the swiftest vessels of the German companies, which are able to make 23 1/2 knots an hour. When the trans-Atlantic combination was formed the government had to deal with a situation in which the swiftest vessels might be under a foreign corporation. The government opened negotiations with Lord Inverclyde and Mr. J. Pierpont Morgan. Both these gentlemen showed the utmost readiness to accede to the wishes of the government, and it had been able to enter into an agreement with both Lord Inverclyde and Mr. Morgan. The Cunard Company, Mr. Balfour said, would construct two vessels, which would have a speed of from twenty-four to twenty-five knots. Mr. Balfour then disclosed the agreement as disclosed by Lord Inverclyde's circular.

## DREAMED OF OIL WELLS.

A corporation has been organized in Poughkeepsie, N. Y., which has as its principal asset a preacher's dream and the concern is boring for oil near Millerton. About a year ago Rev. Thomas Neal, of Busti, was called to Millerton to preach in a church where the pastor had just resigned. While in Millerton he had a curious vision. He dreamed of a stretch of hilly land surrounded by a gloomy forest. He saw derricks rise toward the sky with engines and drills at work. Suddenly the dream changed, the machinery disappeared and oil spouted from the ground. Mr. Neal awoke with the firm conviction that oil abounded in that city. He told his religious friends about it, and then tramped around the county until he located the spot that he had seen in his vision. Then he started promoting a company to get out the oil. Residents held a public meeting, subscribed for stock, and some took options on 1,000 acres of land where the oil was supposed to be. Later, Mr. Neal was crowded out, as the stockholders heard of a similar dream he had in Busti, which do not pay any dividend.

## SLOT MACHINES ILLEGAL.

The Corporation counsel has advised the District of Columbia Commissioners that, in his opinion, the "coin operating machine" cannot be allowed to work within their jurisdiction. Mr. Duvall believes it to be a gambling device, within the meaning of the statute law, and has so advised the Commissioners. The matter was brought to the attention of the authorities several days ago through a communication of the assessor, stating that application had been made for a license to operate the machine in question. The assessor had doubts about the matter of issuing the license and asked instructions. The Commissioners accordingly requested Counsel Duvall to render an opinion upon the legal questions involved. Mr. Duvall states that upon the information submitted to him the machine is a device designed to play a game of chance for money, and, therefore, punishable under section 865 of the District code. The assessor will inform the applicant in accordance with the counsel's opinion.

## SKELTON IN A TRUNK.

Bayard Wright, local agent for the Weems Steamboat Company, at Rappahannock, yesterday discovered a skeleton in a trunk which had been stored in the company's warehouse there for about eight years. The skeleton was apparently that of a child 12 years old. Some tattered clothing hung around the remains. The trunk was rather more than medium size and the body was considerably bent in order to get it inside. The trunk and contents were thrown into the tide. There was no name or address of any kind on the trunk.
