MACHINE THAT COMPUTES.

The stereotyped remark about some of our modern machinery having almost human intelligence gains new force as the result of the invention of a Louisville man. A. C. Schuman, of that city, has been granted patents on an adding machine that computes all four sums in arithmetic—addition, subtraction, division and multiplication. Mr. Schuman has already gained more than local distinction by his inventions in the field of applied mechanics. The inventor was found in his workshop finishing up a full-size working model of the new machine. With the aid of this model Mr. Schuman gave a demonstration of the working powers of the invention. Its manipulation involves no mental arithmetical calculation to assist in the working. The process is as nearly a mechanical operation as possible. The adding machines now in use are built for processes of addition alone. It is possible, however, to use them for simple subtraction. When Mr. Schuman some time ago turned his attention to computing machinery he invented two machines. One of these is an adding machine and typewriter combined, suitable for making out itemized bills and the like. This machine which was the first one patented by Mr. Schuman, only computes sums in addition. The machine which is available for all four processes of computation is limited as to typewriting facilities. The change from one form of calculation to another means only the shifting of the bar and the turning of a crank so many times. The odd part of this uncanny machine is that it computes sums in five or six figures more quickly than the shorter ones. This is due to the mechanical construction. In division the fractional remainder is always set down on both machines at about the same time, but the letters on the simple machine were granted first," said Mr. Schuman. "The machine which computes all sums was invented before the other."

CLAIMED ACTRESS SHOT HIM.

In a statement made last Sunday, Barry Johnston, the actor, who shot and killed Kate Hassett, in Philadelphia, and who died on Monday of his own wounds, declared that the woman first shot him. In his statement, Johnston told of his arrival in Philadelphia the day before the tragedy, and continued: "I went to her room surreptitiously. It was between 8 and 8:30 o'clock. I got in the street door by a key I had found in her room previously. The door to her room was locked, so I went to a room, directly over hers, which was open. I found a rope in the bureau, and tying one end to a shutter hinge, I let myself down hand over hand to her window and entered. I lay on the bed until I heard voices in the street, and went down and met her in front of the house. 'Why, Barry,' she exclaimed, 'I have found you out. You have been false to me,' I said. She denied it, and said she could explain. We went down to a street below, and I said to her: 'You have often proposed that we tie together, have nothing to live for. Here is your pistol in her hand and said: 'Take it!' 'No, I won't,' she said. 'Take it quick; you have often dared me to commit suicide with you.' She grabbed the revolver out of my hand and pulled the trigger and shot me. The ball entered my left breast. I felt a sensation of pain immediately afterward, and I then shot at her. I cannot remember just how many times I fired. I think it was two or three. I fell into the arms of a sergeant of police and was taken to the hospital."

RELICS OF PREHISTORIC MAN.

A dispatch from Tacoma, Wash., says that one of the richest finds in relics of prehistoric man perhaps ever made is that unearthed by Capt. Francis Tuttle, of the revenue cutter Bear, during her recent trip in the Arctic seas. A house built by human beings, probably thousands of years ago, was found, and Capt. Toggler, senior officer of the fleet, now has some of the utensils used by the people who made it a habitation. The house was partially imbedded in a cliff, fronting on the ocean, 15 miles southeast of Point Barrow. At the point where the house was discovered the cliff rose about 70 feet from the ocean. Forty feet above tidewater and 30 feet from the top of the cliff one end of the house was exposed. The house was built somewhat after the plan of the structures of primitive inhabitants of America. The ribs of an enormous whale or of some animal now extinct were used for a framework, and over these skins had been stretched. No trace of the skins, however, could be found, but the framework of the house was intact. Captain Tuttle is of the opinion that the house is one of a settlement or village that stood on the shores of the Arctic in the dim past. At the instigation of Capt. Tuttle, the natives of Point Barrow made excavations in the cliff and

brought away all the utensils that could be discovered. The immense bones that made up the framework of the house were left on the shores of the Arctic. The utensils found at the spot consist of a halber for a boat, a carved ivory rowlock, four stone knives, a bone knife and a skinning knife.
