THE CASE OF VENEZUELA.

Germany's claims against the Venezuelan government, which have remained in abeyance during the Matos insurrection, now suppressed by President Castro, amount by this time to a round \$15,000,000, including compensation for German subjects' losses during the period of civil war; payment for merchandise and munitions of war supplied to the Castro government by German merchants, and liquidation of arrears of interest and sinking fund payments on a \$10,000,000 loan negotiated with German and French capitalists six years ago. This latter item, amounting to from \$2,500,000 to \$3,000,000, is doubtless the urgent account in the transaction. The proceeds of the loan were largely squandered in Venezuela under the peculiar methods of Latin-American finance. Public improvements of importance, which were supposed to be provided for by this loan, failed to materialize. Having frittered away most of the money borrowed, the Castro government was plunged incidentally into the hurly-burly and heat of a civil war, which soon reduced the republic to a state of national bankruptcy. Peace has been restored; but the burden of the debt has not been removed. The situation of the allied governments of Europe which have interested themselves in the collection of Venezuelan debts find a fair opportunity for playing long-range international politics. They have ascertained in advance from the United States government that any methods of coercion short of actual alienation of territory would be sanctioned at Washington, if applied at Caracas. This tacit understanding was communicated also to Great Britain and France, where Venezuelan public and private claims aggregating about \$10,000,000 are held. There is thus disclosed an international demand upon President Castro for \$25,000,000, with warships of the three most powerful maritime nations back of the claims. The vast delta of the Orinoco and the mountain ranges surrounding it are veritable mines of material wealth, and the population of the region, once freed from devastating wars and grinding oppression, would become large and generous customers in the world's markets.

If the fever of European colonization is to strike in on this continent, this is the spot where its earliest manifestations might be anticipated. Maintenance of the international doctrine that the soil of the American continent is no longer open to European acquisition carries with it a constantly increasing responsibility. The chances of embroilment of the United States with foreign powers ought not to be contingent upon the payment or non-payment of sums of money furnished from Europe and spent or stolen in South America. If such transactions must be made, it might be cheaper in the end to make the necessary financial arrangements here, as suggested by Banker Seligman in a tentative application to the State Department.—[Philadelphia Record.]

FOLLOWED HIM TO WASHINGTON.

Miss Lavinia Campbell, a pretty girl of Hampton, Va., eighteen years old, went to Washington with her father Tuesday morning in search of her lover, Howard Scott Foster, a young business man of Old Point Comfort, and after finding her fiancé, who is said to have left Hampton on the eve of their proposed wedding there, the couple were married about 10 o'clock that night at a hotel. Miss Campbell and her father arrived in Washington early in the day in search of the missing bridegroom. He had been in the habit of staying at the hotel on previous visits, and he was sought there. He did not have a room at the hotel, but in the afternoon he sent a messenger for his mail, which was refused him. The young man, who is about twenty-three years old, then visited the hotel himself. His fiancée had left the place with her father in the meantime, on a search for Mr. Foster. As he left the hotel he met Miss Campbell, and returned to the place with her. Mr. Campbell had a conversation with his daughter's intended husband, and, apparently satisfied that the matrimonial affairs of the couple were advancing smoothly, he went back to Hampton on the evening boat, leaving his daughter in Washington. Mr. Foster left his intended bride early in the evening, and she sat in the parlor of the hotel awaiting his arrival. It was nearly 10 o'clock when he arrived with a minister, and the knot was quickly tied.

A dispatch from Newport News says a warrant was secured Tuesday afternoon for Howard S. Foster, the young man who was to have been married Sunday night to Miss Lavinia Campbell, but failed to show up for the ceremony. The warrant, which was obtained by an uncle of the girl, charges seduction under promise of marriage. A telegram from her received late Tuesday night states that Foster and Miss Campbell were married in Washington. The warrant against Foster will be dismissed.


