## THE RACE PROBLEM.

Gov. Heyward of South Carolina yesterday received notice that the legislature of Wisconsin has passed a resolution calling on the governor, to that State to request all the other governors to appoint delegates to a convention called to meet in Atlanta for the purpose of discussing and, if possible, solving the race problem. The governor was asked for his opinion. He replied as follows:

"From every standpoint this action of the Wisconsin legislature is worse than meaningless. Such a convention could not possibly bring any result, so far as the proper aspect of the subject is concerned. Of all available reasons for the consideration of the race question, I know of nothing more directly aimed in absolutely the wrong direction, so far as the proper solution of the problem is concerned, than would be such a convention. The personnel of such a body would be a heterogeneous mixture entirely without the proper knowledge of the subject they were supposed to be able to discuss. The interference and ignorance of a long range, would-be philanthropist has done more to create a race question where none exists than all other combined agencies that have ever come within my observation. I have always been a friend of the negro and never spoke with more sincere friendly consideration for his interests than in what I am now saying. Right thinking white men and right thinking negroes have always with proper understanding gotten along well together. The other type of negro needs to be dealt with. This outside interference involves many conflicting dangers and displays absolute ignorance of the fundamental principles of the question. It is a charitable reflection, mildly expressed, to remind these champions of such rapid nonsense how the streets of Jerusalem were kept clean. I shall take no official notice of the action of the Wisconsin legislature and shall certainly not appoint delegates unless urged to do so by my constituents."

## TO SUPERCEDE SKILLED LABOR.

One of the most sensational moves made by the American Window Glass Company was inaugurated in Pittsburgh, Pa., yesterday when the executive committee of the corporation issued a formal notice to its workmen that after a lapse of seven days, and on March 14, all of the factories of the American Window Glass Company will close for the season, irrespective of what other companies will do. The moment the factories are closed the company has arranged that a large force of men will be put to work to equip them with the new glass blowing machinery. It is said that all of the factories of the company will be equipped with the new machines, which will do the work of the skilled labor by machine and removing from the glass factory the highest priced skilled labor known in the country. It will give the company glass production at a cost of less than one-third of the cost under the hand labor.

President James A. Chambers, of the American Window Glass Company, in discussing the latest action of his corporation, said the blowing machines would be installed in all of the company's plants as rapidly as possible. The shutdown, however, will be for considerable time.

The action of the American Window Glass Company in closing its factories and installing its machinery is said to be its answer to the independents, who have refused to come to any agreement concerning a uniform closing of plants this spring. To make more emphatic the statements of the big corporation, it was stated that a charter had been applied for under the laws of New Jersey, for the incorporation of the American Window Glass Machine Company, which is to have capital of \$20,000,000, all of which is to be controlled by the directors and officers of the glass company, and which will own all the patents and manufacture all of the machines for making window glass that now exist.

The officials of the company declined last night to make any statement regarding the plans of this new corporation until the charter had been secured, but in a general way it was explained that in the new blowing machines were to be manufactured exclusively for the American Window Glass Company and installed in the works, being paid for on the royalty plan. All former lists have been withdrawn by the American Company, and it is now believed that a cut in rates will be made.

## VIRGINIA NATIONAL BANKS.

The condition of the national banks of Virginia is more satisfactory than it has been for years. The figures show that there are sixty national banks in Virginia in healthy condition against fifty-four in February, 1902. The total resources of the sixty banks, with corresponding liabilities, are \$57,846,402, and a year ago the figures were \$49,214,172, an increase of more than \$8,000,000. There is an increase in one year of over \$4,000,000 in the money of depositors held by the banks, a testimonial of prosperity in the State. One year ago the total capital stock in the then fifty-four banks was \$6,159,215. This amount now stands at \$6,580,000. The total loans and discounts are \$33,115,132 against \$27,889,252. The banks have up \$4,946,650 of government bonds to secure their circulating notes, against \$4,318,750 in February of last year.

The surplus funds of the banks now stand at \$3,224,580 against \$2,331,483 one year ago. Undivided profits, \$2,345,099 against \$2,726,366.

The national banks of no State in the country make a better showing under the February call of the comptroller than those of Virginia.
