

### MORE RUSSIAN LOSSES.

Advices received in St. Petersburg from Viceroy Alexieff to the Czar tell of more Russian losses. Fighting along the Yalu river is assuming more serious proportions and the Japanese appear to have the advantage. They are concentrated in considerable force, with war material and pontoons, at and around Wiju. Shots were exchanged south of the river Pomakua, where a Russian detachment of 2 officers and 32 men lost 3 killed and 2 officers and 13 men wounded. The Russian force regained the Russian side of the river under the protection of two guns.

Russian disasters due to mines continue. The Czar has received the following telegram from Viceroy Alexieff, at Port Arthur, bearing yesterday's date: "I respectfully report to your majesty that today, during the placing of mines by some steam launches, Lieutenant Pell and 20 men were killed through a mine exploding prematurely under the stern of one of the launches."

Viceroy Alexieff's announcement of the destruction of a launch and the loss of 21 men by the explosion of a Russian torpedo at Port Arthur has added to the gloom which has prevailed since the disaster to the Petropavlovsk. "We are paying the price of carelessness," said a member of the Admiralty, "and previous disasters seem to teach nothing."

The war commission suppressed part of the Viceroy's dispatch, which showed where the mines were being laid. It is believed that as launches were employed they were mining the entrance to the harbor in order to prevent the Japanese from forcing an entrance and attempting to destroy the remaining ships. It is evident from the closing of the entrance that Viceroy Alexieff has no intention of letting his ships go to sea again even against an inferior force, though this may not be the policy of Vice Admiral Skrydloff, who will determine on a plan of operations when he assumes command.

Rumors are in circulation in St. Petersburg that two beggars attempted the assassination of General Kuropatkin when he was in Niuchwang a few days ago. It is said that the beggars succeeded in approaching the general and were talking to him when a guard noticed that one of them put his hand inside his robe. The men were seized and searched and knives were found upon them. It is said that the men were Japanese.

A special cable to the Chicago Daily News from Stockholm says: "It is reported in responsible quarters that certain strange craft, said to be Japanese submarines, are hovering on the east coast of Sweden. They were last seen off the fortified harbor of Farosund, in the Island of Gotland, in the center of the Baltic Sea. It is reported that the St. Petersburg authorities have been advised of the matter, and are alarmed for the safety of the Baltic fleet."

The Berlin Borsen Courier says it learns on good authority that Russia has abandoned all intention of dispatching the Baltic squadron to the far East because its departure would leave Russia's European ports unguarded. Most reports in St. Petersburg agree that Russia no longer contemplates sending the Black Sea squadron to the far East. The Berlin Post, however, says that in diplomatic circles of the Russian capital it is declared in the most circumstantial manner that Russia proposes to obtain for her fleet liberty to pass through the Dardanelles. If need be, the Russian government is prepared to make the question of the neutrality of the Dardanelles the subject of diplomatic discussion. The renewed application which has been made to the Porte by the Russian government for the payment of the remainder of the indemnity in curbed in the Russo-Turkish war is interpreted as an indication of Russia's desire regarding the Dardanelles.

**Ancient Shrine Uncovered.**

The London Times publishes an article by Edouard Naville and H. R. Hall, in which they announce the discovery through excavations made in behalf of the Egypt Exploration Fund of the most ancient shrine yet uncovered, at Thebes. It is the mortuary chapel of King Mentubetep Nebkhera, of the eleventh dynasty, who reigned 2,500 years before Christ. The chapel is in an unexpectedly good state of preservation and it is not doubted that a great deal will be learned through this discovery of the history and art of the eleventh dynasty.

An archaeological undertaking of a most important character is about to be set afoot; namely the complete excavation of Heracleum. It is proposed that this vast work be carried out by the co-operation of Italy with all the civilized countries, and that there will be a central managing committee in Rome, with national committees elsewhere. The scheme there is good reason to believe, meets with the full support of the Italian government.

"Everybody" for May has been received from the Ridgeway-Thayer Co., New York, and shows a most attractive table of contents. In "The passing of Finland" is described the Russian oppression which has driven 200,000 Finns into the United States. "A clearing-house for babies" tells of the large number of door-step babies in New York, whose lines have fallen in pleasant places. "May the Christian dance, play cards, etc." is ably discussed by representative men in many denominations. In the well prepared article on "Consumption" Eugene Wood declares this disease to be catching, preventable and curable. Fiction is represented by seven good stories and, "With the Procession," gives stories, personalities and events that are making history.
