CAPTURE OF INNER FORT?

There is current in Chefoo a Chinese rumor that the Japanese have captured one of the inner forts of Port Arthur, losing 1,000 men in the engagement. It cannot, however, be confirmed.

The remarkable raid of the Russian Vladivostok squadron evidently is over. The squadron disappeared Saturday off Cape Hanashi, steering to the north, and it has not been reported since. It is assumed to be returning to Vladivostok. Whether or not a portion of Vice Admiral Kamimura's squadron is awaiting the Russians off Vladivostok is a carefully guarded secret.

The transports Sado, Hitachi and Izuma were the only ones overhauled by the Russians. Japan had 13 transports in and near the Strait of Korea the morning the Sado and the Hitachi were caught, and she was fortunate that only the three ships mentioned were overtaken by the enemy.

It is impossible to get complete facts concerning the sinking of the Hitachi. She evidently failed to stop when signaled to do so by the Russian vessel. The claim is made that Captain Campbell, the English master of the Hitachi, refused to stop and planned to ram the Russian, but this is denied. It is said that the Japanese officers on board the Hitachi declined to surrender and required Captain Campbell to keep his ship going. The assertion that the Russians fired upon the lifeboats in which men were escaping from the Japanese transport has been fully substantiated.

The raid of the Vladivostok squadron has brought an unwarranted amount of criticism upon Vice Admiral Kamimura from Japanese, and his failure to catch the Russians in the fog off Gansan, off the coast of Korea, when the Japanese transport Kinsuo was sunk, on April 25, with a loss of about 200 men, has been recalled. Some of the critics even declare that if Vice Admiral Kamimura fails to catch the Russian vessels before they reach Vladivostok he should either resign from the navy or commit suicide.

Dinners in the Dark.

In smart French and Swiss society the latest vogue is to dine in the dark. Dinner begins as usual, but suddenly, to the surprise of the guests, the light goes out and all is left in darkness. Nothing has gone wrong, and before the guests have recovered from their astonishment the dining room doors open and shadowy forms steal in bearing a blazing mass of light. It is the next course illuminated. Silently the figures come to your side, and in a few moments on everyone's plate is, say, your fish, and a delicately shaded light by which to eat it but otherwise the room remains in complete darkness. This new mode was first introduced in serving the ice, and with gooseberry ice, which is a very favorite sweet just now, the electric lights, shaded with a pellicule green in the shape of a gooseberry, are very effective. The fashion has caught on in the most amazing way, and some foreign hostesses, who issue their invitations, "Come and dine in the dark," are meeting with no refusals. Sometimes every other course is served in the dark, and occasionally only the ice. At one hotel in Lucerne the proprietor serves the ices every night in this way. The utmost excitement prevails when the lights in the dining room go out, and all eyes are strained to see in what quaint and novel form the illuminated dish will appear. Great ingenuity is shown in the various designs which are nightly adopted, and it has become quite the thing now to dine at that hotel.

Millionaires Ask More Pay.

William Rockefeller, James Stillman, E. McK. Twombly, D. O. Mills and one or two other multi-millionaires of the New York Central Directorate, have asked for a raise of wages. "I do not think \$10 is sufficient compensation for attendance at a directors' meeting," said William Rockefeller. "Why, some companies pay \$50." "The Canadian Pacific pays \$100 a year," said James Stillman, president of the National City Bank. "What can a man do with the thing?" "I can always use it," said D. O. Mills. "But is not enough," said William Rockefeller. Finally it was agreed to leave the matter to a special committee composed of J. P. Morgan, W. K. Vanderbilt and James Stillman, who are expected to raise the pay of the directors. William Rockefeller insisted that J. P. Morgan be put on the committee, because, as he said, he is in Europe spending money, and when he gets back he will be glad of a chance to get more fees.


