



### A SENSATIONAL CHARGE.

A charge delivered by Judge Daniel Partridge, jr., to the Dallas county, Ga., grand jury has created a great sensation. Judge Partridge is a law partner of Senator Pettus, and was born and reared in the heart of the black belt of Alabama. The principal theme of his charge was the negro question, and he urged the grand jury to do their duty in fully investigating the charge against the three white deputy sheriffs and the seven negroes confined in jail charged with the lynching of the negro Edward Bell several weeks ago. Judge Partridge criticised the white people most severely for their treatment of the negroes, and declared that the lower class of whites were responsible for the lawlessness among the negroes by setting bad examples for their inferiors to follow. He spoke of the faithfulness of the negroes during the war, declaring that if they were now given equal justice with the white people they would make better citizens. He denounced that class of southern gentlemen who carry pistols in their pockets for the purpose of shooting down helpless and inoffensive negroes upon the least provocation.

The charge was pronounced by conservative citizens to be the most sensational ever delivered in Dallas county, and it was freely predicted that the grand jury would free the ten lynchers after hearing Judge Partridge's charge, notwithstanding the fact that one of the alleged lynchers had already confessed to the crime and implicated the white deputies and other prominent white citizens. This prediction proved to be well founded, as the grand jury, after hearing the evidence, recommended that the men charged with the lynching be discharged.

Col. W. W. Quarles, the prosecuting attorney for the State, made the charge in open court that the jury had been influenced by the friends of the prisoners.

### Lynchings Threatened.

Lynchings are threatened in four places in western Pennsylvania owing to assaults on white women by negroes. Besides the assault committed on Mrs. Thomas Bogan, at Patton, Pa., by a negro, who escaped an armed posse, four girls have been attacked in various places during the past twenty-four hours. Ella Stille, aged sixteen, daughter of Jerry Stille, superintendent of the Clarendon Iron Works, was assaulted Thursday night at 11 o'clock by two men, who dragged her out on the bridge across the Monongahela river at Monongahela City. Harvey Barnes, of Monongahela City, was arrested yesterday. In the struggle the girl's arm was broken. Hettie Adams, a cousin, who accompanied Miss Stille, is missing, having run when her companion was attacked. Miss Stille was saved by the approach of a telegraph operator, who heard her cries. At Kittanning, Pa., the 9-year-old daughter of Thos. Coulter while going to school yesterday morning, was assaulted by two masked men. They seized her while passing a group of trees. It is reported she will die. Effort is being made to secure bloodhounds with which to pursue the criminals. Beasie Hawkes, aged sixteen, of Homestead, was on her way home from her work Thursday night when a negro attacked her and attempted to assault her. Miss Hawkes fought and succeeded in wrenching herself free and running to her home. Miss Ethel Stagg, of Homestead, was attacked by a negro, but got away.

The negro arrested at Patton, Pa., for an assault made on Mrs. Bogan was released, according to his captor, Constable Jackson, the prisoner having proven an alibi. The 300 infuriated citizens who set out Thursday to lynch the negro discredit the constable's story, and believe it is a ruse to allow the officers to get him to safety to prevent violence. Yesterday the men, led by the husband, father, and brothers of the victim, were still searching for the constable, whom they believe to have the negro in custody.

### Obituary of a Dog.

Rev. Mr. Winchester, of Middletown, N. Y., who recently gained notoriety by declaring that a minister could live comfortably on \$12 a month, and publishing his bill of fare has given himself further notoriety. "Rover," his pet dog, died a few days ago, and Mr. Winchester caused to be published a long obituary of the defunct canine. The dog's body was robed in white, covered with flowers, and buried in the preacher's grounds at Oakview. In the obituary the minister took as his text, Ecclesiastes, iii., 20—"Who knoweth the spirit of man, whether it goeth upward, and the spirit of the beast whether it goeth downward to the earth?" In describing the ravages the distemper which brought about the dog's death the minister said: "Sunday he could not speak with his voice, or with that wonderful 'talker,' for his tail refused to wag. The sun was going down as Rover went to sleep. Then we robed him in white and buried him covered with flowers."
